Access change for the Teck Emergency Department at Royal Inland Hospital

KAMLOOPS – Kamloops and area residents are advised of an important change regarding access to the Teck Emergency Department (ED) at <u>Royal Inland Hospital</u> (RIH).

Effective Wednesday, Oct. 23 at 7:30 a.m., please enter the Teck ED through the new permanent sliding glass doors located directly under the large 'EMERGENCY' sign. The new entrance is located to the right of the temporary entrance which has been in place since Aug. 2023. Signage will be available to help guide patients.

Short-term public parking for the ED continues to be located on the right side of the drive leading to the roundabout where the entrance is located (see <u>parking map</u>).

To access the ED from the public parkade in the Clinical Services Building (CSB), use the parkade elevator to Level 2 to access the pedestrian bridge to the Main Building. Follow the 'EMERGENCY' signage.

Anyone unsure whether an emergency room visit is needed can call HealthLink BC at 8-1-1, or visit www.HealthLinkBC.ca for non-emergency health information from nurses, dietitians and pharmacists 24 hours a day, seven days per week.

Those with non-emergency health concerns that require attention from a medical professional within 12-24 hours should book an appointment at the <u>Kamloops Urgent Primary Care & Learning Centre</u> by calling 250-314-2256. The centre is open daily from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., including statutory holidays.

Meetings that may or must be closed to the public

90 (1)	A part of a council meeting may be closed to the public if the subject matter being considered relates to or is one or more of the following:			
	(a)	personal information about an identifiable individual who holds or is being considered for a position as an officer, employee or agent of the municipality or another position appointed by the municipality;		
	(b)	personal information about an identifiable individual who is being considered for a municipal award or honour, or who has offered to provide a gift to the municipality on condition of anonymity;		
	(c)	labour relations or other employee relations;		
	(d)	the security of the property of the municipality;		
	(e)	the acquisition, disposition or expropriation of land or improvements, if the council considers that disclosure could reasonably be expected to harm the interests of the municipality;		
	(f)	law enforcement, if the council considers that disclosure could reasonably be expected to harm the conduct of an investigation under or enforcement of an enactment;		
	(g)	litigation or potential litigation affecting the municipality;		
	(h)	an administrative tribunal hearing or potential administrative tribunal hearing affecting the municipality, other than a hearing to be conducted by the council or a delegate of council;		
	(i)	the receipt of advice that is subject to solicitor-client privilege, including communications necessary for that purpose;		
	(j)	information that is prohibited, or information that if it were presented in a document would be prohibited, from disclosure under section 21 of the <i>Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act</i> ;		
	(k)	negotiations and related discussions respecting the proposed provision of a municipal service that are at their preliminary stages and that, in the view of the council, could reasonably be expected to harm the interests of the municipality if they were held in public;		
	(I)	discussions with municipal officers and employees respecting municipal objectives, measures and progress reports for the purposes of preparing an annual report under section 98 [annual municipal report];		
	(m)	a matter that, under another enactment, is such that the public may be excluded from the meeting;		
	(n)	the consideration of whether a council meeting should be closed under a provision of this subsection or subsection (2);		
	(o)	the consideration of whether the authority under section 91 [other persons attending closed meetings] should be exercised in relation to a council meeting.		

90 (2)	A part of a council meeting must be closed to the public if the subject matter being considered relates to one or more of the following:			
	(a)	a request under the <i>Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act</i> , if the council is designated as head of the local public body for the purposes of that Act in relation to the matter;		
	(b)	the consideration of information received and held in confidence relating to negotiations between the municipality and a provincial government or the federal government or both, or between a provincial government or the federal government or both and a third party;		
	(c)	a matter that is being investigated under the <i>Ombudsperson Act</i> of which the municipality has been notified under section 14 [ombudsperson to notify authority] of that Act;		
	(d)	a matter that, under another enactment, is such that the public must be excluded from the meeting.		
90 (3)	If the only subject matter being considered at a council meeting is one or more matter referred to in subsection (1) or (2), the applicable subsection applies to the entire meeting
