


#### IN CANADA:

- Women self reported
   553,000 sexual assaults in
   2014
- Women are 10 times more likely than men to be sexually assaulted
- 82% of all victims of sexual assault under the age of 18 are female
- Girls are four times more likely than boys to be sexually abused by a family member
- Disabled women experience sexual assault violence at about three times the rate of non-disabled women
- Sexual assault is the only crime in Canada that is not declining
