

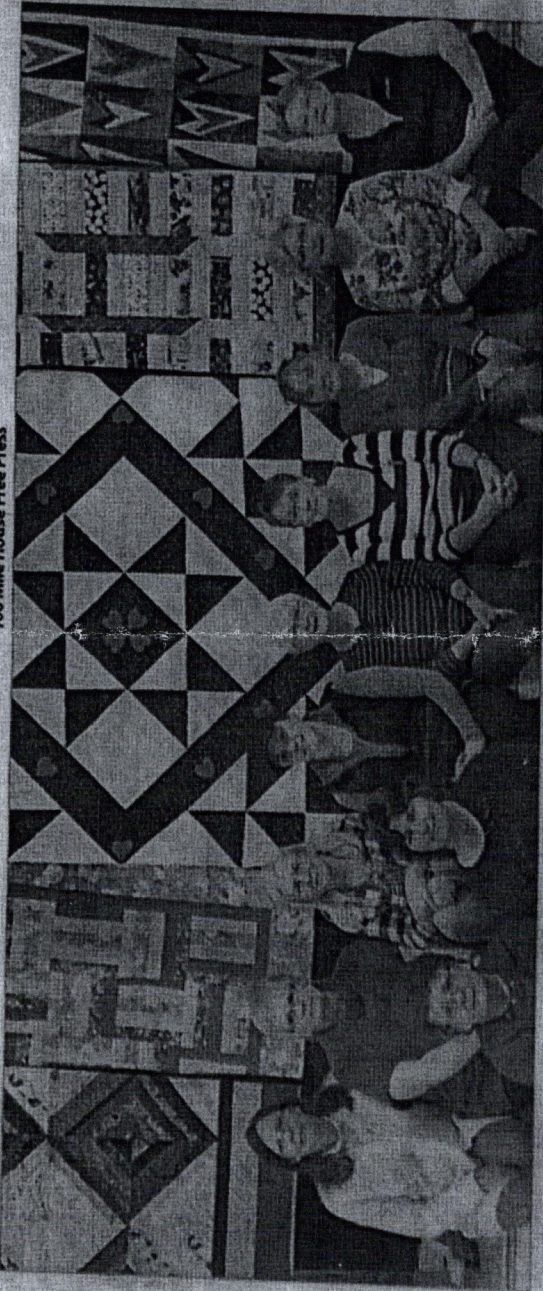

Quilters have made 111 quilts for chemotherapy patients

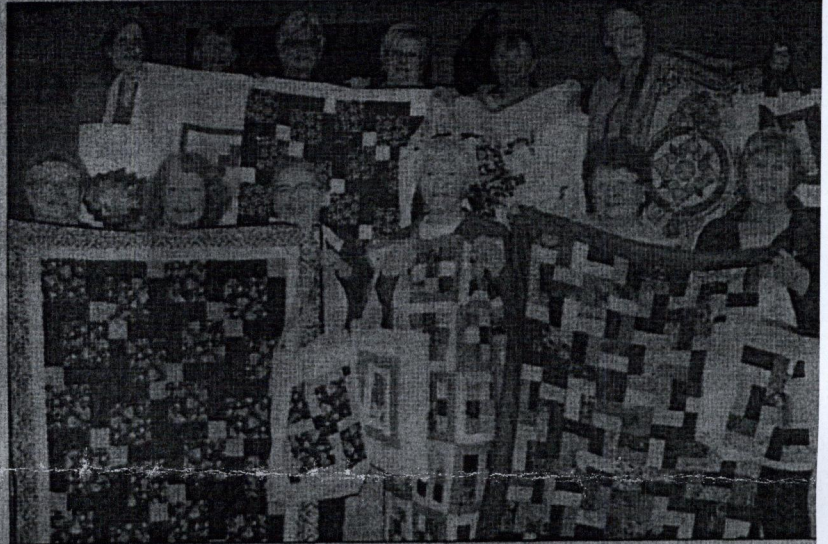
The Interlakes' Log Cabin Quilters (LCQ) have been creating beautiful quilts since 1990. However, their Quilts for Chemo

program only started in March 2014. Since then, the group has delivered 111 quilts to 100 Mile Hospital's chemotherapy patients. Two special nurses at the hospital are thrilled

with the program and make sure their patients each receive a quilt, which has resulted in many thank-you cards. Other local patients go to Kamloops and Kelowna for treatments, and LCQ has several more quilts to donate when those patients are ready.

LCQ comprises many very enthusiastic ladies, but they also have friends who donate quilts, such as the small group of 100 Mile House quilters who made seven quilts for their cause.

They appreciate the financial support of the Cariboo Regional District, the 100 Mile House & District Arts Council, and Interlakes

Each donated quilt has its own bag stuffed with something to read, a calendar, pen, toque or socks, and a soap sock containing a bar of soap. Each quilt has a label embroidered by those members who have embroidery machines and carries a message and the LCQ name. A card wishes them well. Soap bags, toques, socks are mostly made by ladies from the Butte's OUT (Of Useful Things) Group. Recently, LCQ also made some medicine bags, which are worn around the neck and hold a bit of medicine. The entire program would not be possible without the many volunteers, for whom we are very thankful. In addition to the chemo program, LCQ's donations include seven quilts to Humboldt; 14 Cariboo wildfire victims; a dozen each year for Royal Inland Hospital's premises; and several to Interlakes residents who have suffered a house fire.
