Previous Year Grant from CRD and District (if applicable):

The Cariboo Regional District approved \$2250 towards age friendly activities per the 2017 Grants for Assistance application by the Age Friendly Society of the South Cariboo. In 2018, the District of 100 Mile House budgeted \$7500 to administer age friendly contracts outside of the Grants for Assistance.

At the recent AGM the Society provided a final report of Age Friendly activities for the year including acknowledgement of community partners, along with a listing of events/speakers/locations/sponsors and financial reporting. A copy of the AGM report is attached.

Current Grant Amount Requested from Cariboo Regional District Areas G, H & L: \$3,000 Current Grant Amount Requested from the District of 100 Mile House: \$2,000

Total Current Grant Amount Requested: \$5,000

(The District of 100 Mile House provided age friendly financial support outside of the Grants for Assistance, substantially strengthening the framework within which age friendly initiatives operate. For example, together with the in-kind support of several partners including the BC Community Response Network, the Age Friendly Society held a Seniors Resource Fair in June 2018 attended by up to 600 people, showcasing 52 booths of support services and businesses. The Society also published the 2018 South Cariboo Seniors Resource Directory distributing, to date, approximately 1700 copies throughout the South Cariboo.)

1. What plans has your organization made to fund its activities over the next 3-5 years?

The Age Friendly Society of the South Cariboo (AFSSC) funds its activities through a combination of volunteer labour, provincial and local government grants, membership dues (sliding scale \$1 - \$20), donations and "in kind" contributions of meeting rooms, advertising/promotion and supplies.

2. If your organization charges user fees/memberships/admission, attach your current fee structure:

It has not been our practice to charge user fees or admission to events. We invite attendees to support age friendly activities by becoming members of the society although membership is not a pre-requisite of attending any events. The rate is on a sliding scale of \$1 to \$20 per person. Membership is intended to give people who have actively supported our events a sense of ownership of the organization. (Membership Form and Guidelines for Working Together are attached.) The Society also receives donations from attendees at events.

3. What are your organization's specific goals and objectives for this year? How do they differ from previous years?

- 1. GOAL: to improve communication and information to/from seniors throughout the South Cariboo
 - a. Objective: To increase effectiveness of communicating age friendly information to South Cariboo seniors through the use of a variety of communication mediums (posters, phone contact, email broadcasts, engagement with partners including posting information on existing information networks such as websites existing in community)
 - b. Objective: To secure funding for and to coordinate a Seniors Resource Fair. This is a collaborative effort requiring engagement of several community partners.
 - c. Objective: To meet regularly with steering committee comprised of people (mostly seniors) who are the eyes, ears and voices of seniors in the South Cariboo (Steering committee currently comprised of up to 18 members)

- 2. GOAL: to reduce social isolation for seniors and increase sense of belonging
 - a. Objective: to hold "gatherings" throughout the South Cariboo featuring guest presenters on subjects of interest to older adults and their families
- 3. GOAL: to build on the projects supporting the Society's purposes generated by the Age Friendly Steering Committee
 - a. Objective: to regularly identify actions and evaluate progress on projects supporting Society purposes that are undertaken by the Society

These goals expand on the successes of previous years and continue to build a safety network amongst seniors that will reduce isolation and provide increased ability for people to support each other with issues such as transportation, health, safety, etc.

4. Who does your organization serve? (% of clients from District, % of clients from South Cariboo)

The Age Friendly Society of the South Cariboo provides services to older adults and their families living in the South Cariboo. We know that our average attendance at gatherings is increasing with 50-150 people attending events. We are aware that people engaged in age friendly events come from across the South Cariboo including 100 Mile House, Lac La Hache, 108 Mile Ranch, Forest Grove, 70 Mile House, Canim Lake, the Interlakes area, Clinton, Horse Lake, Tsq'escen, and Lone Butte.

5. Does your organization receive a rental subsidy from the CRD and/or District? If so, how much?

We have not received rental subsidies from the District of 100 Mile House or the Cariboo Regional District. We do request not-for-profit rates when renting the Valley Room and the South Cariboo Rec Centre in order to keep costs to a minimum. Wherever possible we request rental subsidies at public halls, etc. for age friendly events. See note 7 below.

- 6. Does your organization receive any benefit from permissive tax exemption, and if so, how much? (information available from District Tax Department) no, not applicable

We hold steering committee meetings in the Meeting Room at the South Cariboo Rec Centre, meet with presenters and participants in the foyer of the Rec Centre, hold special meetings in the District of 100 Mile House Council Chambers and access office space in the District office and the South Cariboo Rec Centre upon occasion. We rent the Valley Room and the Rec Centre for events.

8. How will you indicate that the CRD and District are contributing to your organization?

It is our practice to acknowledge frequently all funding and donations on all our agendas, information packages, posters, and public presentations. See sample poster attached to application.

Although every effort is made to reduce costs at every level we do require funding to cover some expenses. In the past we have had substantial sponsorship and in-kind contributions. With the recent state of emergency we anticipate more difficulty in securing sponsors and donations.

We have enjoyed stable and supportive relationships with all levels of government and several local businesses and organizations. It has been our standard practice to seek inkind contributions wherever possible and to partner with businesses/service providers/clubs and organizations in order to minimize costs.

- Planning is done from a strengths-based approach and acknowledges an individual's right to privacy (confidentiality) and self-direction.
- We will learn from previous successes and lessons while taking innovative approaches to service provision and approaches
- When developing rural community strategies, we will consider service sustainability which includes reviewing economic feasibility.
- We will lead by example by displaying honesty, commitment, trustworthiness, respect and openness in our processes.
- In order to constantly seek improvement to the work we do, we will participate in regular visioning and evaluation of our work.



What is the role of the Board of Directors?


Typical duties of Boards of Directors include:
