The Hot July Nights event took place this year on July 13, 14 and 15. This year's event was marked by perfect weather and a record number of participants and spectators in attendance. The weather was excellent for the poker run and barbeque on Saturday as well as on Sunday for the main event as well. One of the highlights of the event was the participation of the Wildfire Recovery Tour which was organized by a Vancouver Island Car Club. This tour started on Vancouver Island, worked its way through the Cariboo to Quesnel and finished up in 100 Mile House at Hot July Nights. Their website promoted businesses along the route as well.

Friday, July 13

A rod run was organized and run from the A & W and out to the 108 Ranch area.

Saturday, July 14

There were 70 participants in the poker run this year which was a record. The poker run started from the South Cariboo Recreation Centre, stopped at several different businesses for cards along the route and finished up at the Iron Horse Pub in Lone Butte for a barbeque dinner for the participants. This was the day that Lone Butte Rocks was happening so the poker run was a great tie in and support of that event.

Sunday, July 15


Registration and vendor set up opened Sunday morning at 8:00 am. The show opened at 10:00 am and ran to 3:00 pm, followed by the awards (31 categories) ceremony. Here are a few key points about the day.

- 275 combined registered and unregistered vehicles & bikes.
 - 48 % from 100 Mile House and immediate area
 - 12 % from Williams Lake / 150 Mile House / Clinton area
 - 40 % from other areas of BC
- We estimate 3000 visitors throughout the day
- Estimated financial input of \$80K \$90K to community over weekend because of event (restaurants, hotels, motels, shopping, fuel)
- There were several food vendors and various other vendors on site Sunday. The Women's Centre had a tent set up selling Tim Hortons coffee and water as a fund raiser. Crimebusters had a tent set up for a fundraising draw as well.
- The South Cariboo Rhythmic Gymnastics Club provided a very colorful demonstration during the band's intermission.
- Laura Dewar, the 100 Mile House Community Wellness manager organized a Wildfire Resiliency Celebration in a 30' x 30' tent on site which garnered a lot of attention. CFJC from Kamloops featured this booth in a newscast.
- Sponsorship monies were spent on local newspaper advertising, radio advertising, internet advertising, prizes, outhouse rentals,

locally produced printing and signs, miscellaneous expenses, and musical entertainment for Sunday.

- Having the permanent outdoor stage set up was a great addition to the park and great for the band.
- The event was advertised in the auto section of the Province as well (at no charge) and on Harrison's List (a website listing car and bike shows throughout western Canada and the US – no charge as well).
- There were two new 4' x 4' signs on site Sunday that listed all of the sponsors. The MC for the day also named the sponsors throughout the course of the day.
- The Hot July Nights website listed all the sponsors as well.
- All of the print advertising and the posters listed the sponsors.


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
