The NCLGA Directors met for their Regular Board Meeting in Prince George on November 16th and 17th 2018. Key highlights from the meeting include:

Report from the President

President Gord Klassen congratulated the Board members who were elected at the General Local Elections and thanked all those members for their service who did not run or were not re-elected. He reported on communications with Mayor Lyn Hall regarding the Enbridge pipeline explosion near Prince George; communications with Peace River Regional District Chair Brad Sperling about the long term landslide crises in the Old Fort, near Fort St. John; follow up with the Province regarding the 2018 NCLGA AGM resolutions as well as conversations that were held at the 2018 UBCM Convention in Whistler.
