## POOL ADVOCACY IN THE SOUTH CARIBOO

1960's Pool Advocacy began

1993 Basic tank was defeated in a referendum, 'too basic'

2001 Arena was designed to have the addition of a pool attached

2008 The South Cariboo Aquatic Society (SCAS) was formed

2010 Feasibility study and design report was completed

2014 Telephone survey by the CRD

CRD & the District of 100 Mile House decided not to proceed

SCAS dissolved

## 72%

Ranked the importance of a pool in the community between 7 and 10 on a scale of 1 to 10 with 10 being 'very important'

## 62%

Indicated that they, or someone in their household, would use a pool in the next few years

## 46%


Reported 'yes' to whether they would approve an increase of \$135 / \$100,000 of assessed property value

14% reported 'not sure'



#### **ESTIMATED OPERATIONAL COSTS**

Total expenditures: \$500,000 - \$600,000

Revenue: \$150,000 - \$200,000

Net expenditures/ taxation: \$350,000 - \$450,000

Recovery rate: 25%-40%
