In general, many small clubs around Canada are struggling with their age base increasing and very few new curlers coming in. We believe that our ability to keep our curling fees at the same rate over the years has contributed to the growth in the sport in 100 Mile. In addition, it is important to note that while we are all getting older, the Club's average age is actually reducing. We are committed to promoting curling to younger generations, which is vital for the continuation of our Club.

Officiators

In order to host regional play-downs, our club requires Certified Level 2 Curling Officiators. Five volunteers took the course in October and will be working towards their Certification over the next few years. This will allow the Club to host a wide variety of regional play-downs and attract out of town visitors to 100 Mile House.
