Re: Partnering for Healthier Communities: North Cariboo Update

Dear North Cariboo Rural Directors:

The Partnering for Healthier Communities: North Cariboo committee (P4HC:NC) is pleased to provide an update of the activities for 2018. The committee members are appreciative of the contributions provided by co-chairs John Massier and Lynnette Winsor.

The Partnering for Healthier Communities North Cariboo is a stakeholder group composed of members representing a wide range of groups, organizations and agencies from across the North Cariboo. It's establishment in 2014 was led by Growing North Cariboo Society and is co-chaired by a representative of the Cariboo Regional District and Northern Health.

The group meets quarterly with a focus on collaboration, creating partnerships and supporting programs and strategies that promote healthy eating, local food security, and physical activity. The committee established the Empowering Family Health project focused on food production and preservation, which has multiple linked components as noted below.



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In 2018 committee members shared information about the P4HC:NC activities by setting up a booth at the Discover Wellness Health Fair in March and Seedy Saturday in April. A Request for Proposals was distributed to Community Associations, School District 28 schools, and the Empowering Family Health group email list, and the proposals were included in an application to the Northern Health Imagine Grant fund. The grant was approved for \$2,225.00 to expand the school gardens at Barlow Creek Elementary and Carson Elementary.

A similar process was used in the fall for the submission of an application to Imagine grant in March 2019 to establish an indoor growing area at Correlieu Secondary School, establish a Medicine Garden and plant fruit trees at Bouchie Lake Elementary and support the Friends of Bouchie Milburn Society to host a workshop series on food processing, storing and preservation.

The P4HC committee appreciates the support of the directors of the North Cariboo Rural Caucus and looks forward to continued collaboration with community groups in the North Cariboo to further healthy, sustainable community development.
