Hey Ian,

The rate for Public Works for two days of work and material is an average of \$3500. Depending on condition and weather throughout the year, with a \$10,000 budget you may be able to keep it maintained. Please keep in mind though, if your parking lot is bad and needs work, then our streets are the same. We can not guarantee that our staff can provide the service you need to maintain that parking lot.

Peters Bros. has an asphalt plant setup in Williams Lake and they are who we buy asphalt and hire for the larger jobs we are unable to perform. There rates for services change every year, but tend to be reasonable. If you contact them in early May, they usually have a schedule for when they come to town and can quote you on what you might need. Andy Fletcher is the main contact for Peters Bros. he can be reached at 250-305-7887. Andy may not be reachable until end of April when they start up for the season.
