Survey Report Eagle View 4D Barrel Racers History

Eagle View 4D Barrel Racers is a social equine club centred at Eagle View Equestrian. Centre on Tawny Way in the Cariboo Regional District. The group has been in existence for approximately 20 years. This is strictly a volunteer group, that meets monthly with a goal to providing. Iriendly, open competitive events for anyone wanting to participate. In collaboration with Kings Arena, and Diamond 7 Performance Horses 2019 saw no less than 28 barrel races.

Survey

During the the 2019 Horsin Around barrel racing event held at Eagle View Equestrian Centre the participants were asked to complete a volunteer survey to assess our financial contribution to the community(1), and identify possible sponsorship funding sources for future races and events. There were 94 entires in the open event and lifty two surveys were completed. The results are as follows:

- Of the fifty two surveyed 14 were from out of rown. With Dawson Creek being the furthest away. 19 from the Cariboo Regional District, With a number stating Quesnel. 16 Williams Lake, and 3 did not state a location.
- What is the number of races attended in the Williams Lake area per year? Tenstated less than 10, sixteen stated 10-20, and sixteen were 20+. Six did not respond to the question.
- Do you shop in Williams Lake while you are here for a race? Fifty one stated they
 did and one stated they did not. (Curiously the one that did not stated their budget
 for the race was \$300.
- 4) The participants were asked to identify where they shopped in Williams Lake.
 a)Restaurants 36. b) Gas Stations 51. c) Hotels 14. d) Hardware Store 23.
 e) Canadian Tire 23 f) Cariboo Spurs 45. g) Beaver Valley Feeds 27. h) Walmart 33. l) Liquor Store 30. j) Other 6 (identified as Bob's Shoes 4 and grobery store 2).
- 5) Participants were asked what is there budget per race while attending events. Events and weekly races can be broken into two different budget categories, and for this survey participants were attending a two day event, which for some means up to 3-4 days of traveling with their horses and families. Those that responded to living locally budgeted on average \$100 to \$300, and those travelling budgeted \$300 to \$600, with one person stating \$800, and another stating unlimited.
- 6) We closed the survey by asking if there was any further comments that could be offered. The overall comments were in full support of not only the facility, but the hard work that goes into putting on these events, and that they are done in a friendly open manner.
