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#### Memorandum:

During the emergencies starting in 2017, it was decided to increase the available spending limits of charge cards for the Volunteer Fire Department Chiefs from \$1500 to \$3000 as there was insufficient CRD staff to accommodate the purchasing required to support operations in an ever-changing dynamic environment. Since that time, the capacity to action and monitor spending has been put into place. By returning to the pre-emergency spending limits of the charge cards, this will ensure fiscal accountability, reduce the likelihood of inappropriate purchases, and increase the opportunity for combined purchases which will reduce overall costs.
