

Announcing the First Nations Virtual Substance Use & Psychiatry Service

FNHA has launched a First Nations Virtual Substance Use and Psychiatry Service. This service is now available to First Nations people and their families living in BC with referral from a health and wellness provider.



- To provide direct virtual access to addictions specialists and psychiatric care for First Nations people and their family members living in BC.
- To provide addictions medicine and psychiatry services where every client encounter is aligned with the principles and practices of cultural safety and humility.
- To provide addictions medicine and psychiatry services where collaborative care planning and wraparound care services are integral to all client encounters.

FNHA also offers a Virtual Doctor of the Day program which provides virtual access to primary care (family practice physicians) for First Nations people and their families living in BC.
