Bylaw Enforcement – Unsightly Premises at 641 Fir Street

Memorandum:

The Cariboo Regional District has received formal complaints that a property located at 641 Fir Street is unsightly in contravention of *Cariboo Regional District Untidy and Unsightly Premises Regulatory Bylaw No. 4628, 2011*. Investigation by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer has validated the complaints. There have been numerous attempts to rectify the situation with no result.

We request that the Board invite the owner of 641 Fir Street to attend the November 13, 2020 Board meeting to show cause as to why the Board should not proceed with enforcement measures to have the property cleaned to appropriate standards. This can include requesting a court order and then recovering any expenditures through property taxes.
