



The following is a list of miscellaneous works that would be required for the improvements to our Club and encourage families to come and participate in the shooting sport.

1 - As we now have a washroom facility c/w sink and toilet, we would need a new in ground holding tank as well as a new fresh water tank c/w pump. This would be the least expensive way to have a working washroom.

This is essential as it would be the best way to attract families to come and participate in our sport.

- 2- Misc. repairs to the interior walls and doors.
- 3- New outdoor deck complete with steps to enable us to have family gatherings and complete with a roof overhang to keep the sun and rain off. This deck could be done in phases as we can start with a 12' x 25' and add on later.
- 4- Three new door landings complete with steps to gain access to our Club and be an exit in the event of a fire situation.
- 5- Three new door lock deadbolts with matching keys as we will be storing misc. Items like a Coffee maker, kettle for tea, Paper towels, toilet paper, pop, drinking water, tea, coffee, etc.

The major portion of the work will need to be done in part with some of our members and some of the work will need to be done through a contractor like the water system for our washroom facilities.

As we like to support our local businesses, all the materials used for these renovations and repairs are purchased locally.

In closing I would like mention that each and every time we are so blessed to receive some funds from the CRD we put ads in the free press and thanking the CRD As this is happening we always get some new members wanting to join our wonderful Club.


