Currently we need 6 members for in-house classes to go ahead. Celeste motioned we drop class number to 4 members instead of 6. Seconded by Jean. Carried.

A discussion was held regarding Log Cabin Quilters paying outside teachers above class costs. Celeste motioned that the cost of outside teachers be divided up between the members who are signed up for that class. All were in favour. Hazel abstained. Guidelines will be changed.
