President Bob Van Gyzen called the meeting to order at 1:00pm. A quorum was present. He welcomed all members in attendance.

Bill Rose read out some parts of our Bylaws to familiarize members of specific details -

- 1). Part 2, Article 4 – Membership is 2 persons per residence/household, over the age of 19, in good standing
- 2). Part 2, Article 5 – Every member must uphold the constitution and comply with these bylaws.
- 3). Part 2, Article 9 – All members are in good standing except a member who has failed to pay his or her current annual membership fee, or any other subscription or debt due and owing by the member to the society, and the member is not in good standing so long as the debt remains unpaid.
- 4). Part 4, Article 22:1 – A member in good standing present at a meeting is entitled to one vote.
- 5). Part 4, Article 22:2 – Voting is by show of hands.
- 6). Part 4, Article 22:3 – Voting by proxy is not permitted.
- 7). Part 5, Article 25:2 – The number of directors must be 5 or a greater number determined from time to time at a general meeting.
- 8). Part 8, Article 46 – Borrowing is not authorized under any circumstance, for any purpose of the society.

Minutes of our Annual General meeting of May 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019 were read out by acting secretary Bill Rose. He called for a motion for approval of the minutes as read, seconded by Owen Wright, no errors or omissions were found. Carried.

Financial statement for the year ending February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019 were handed out to the members. We showed 47 members on our membership list but only collected dues from 32?? ( meaning that 15 members did not pay for 2019 ) ??

Bill Rose asked the treasurer to make a note on future financial statements that of the members equity \$ 5000.00 was donated by Cariboo Regional District to be used for a communications tower only. A motion to accept the financial statement as presented was made by Willi Breining, seconded by Bonnie Breining. Carried.



Road Maintenance – Bob Van Gyzen reported that he spoke with David Rhodes of Dawson Road Maintenance in 100 Mile House. They are currently busy working on flooded areas and washouts and are not able to look at any road conditions currently.

Bill Rose read out e-mail correspondence between him and the Ministry of Transportation office in Williams Lake, B.C. Concerning our road condition. The seal-coating performed in 2006 has stood up well in most areas but needs some work in a few places that have large potholes that cannot be repaired with “ Cold Patch “. We are on the list for upgrades as and when funding is available. Our group was actually meeting with the Area Manager Roads from 100 Mile on another project so would approach him on this topic.

Fishing Report – Bob Hansen has not done much fishing this year but reports from other fishermen on the lake show good productions of large Kokanee with Ice Fishing. We were to get another shipment of Gerard species this year but received none. We did however receive 35,000 Kokanee fingerlings in May.

No other Old Business

#### New Business

Dues structure for 2020/2021. Our membership list shows 47 members but we received only 32 paid memberships ? ( \$320.00 ). Due to the fact that we will be working on some projects that require funding, Owen Wright spoke about the need for an increase in our membership yearly dues. He made a motion that we increase our yearly fee from \$10.00 to \$15.00 per year, seconded by Bonnie Breining. Carried.

A few members has already paid their 2020/2021 dues of \$10.00 prior to the meeting. It was suggested that those who have already paid could donate \$5.00 additional to cover the newer fee.

Owen Wright spoke about the possibility of getting construction of a cell tower at the West end of Timothy Lake. He and several other residents have had trees take out their power lines negating our phone service. We currently do not have “ Cell Service “ so in case of an emergency we have no contact with the outside world.

Bill Rose has a contact person from the “Telus Management Team” and suggested that we give this to Owen to approach them with our dilemma and ask for their help to get us a service tower.

Mark Widsten advised that the 911 service works from any cell phone even though we do not have a proper system currently. Apparently it automatically connects via a satellite?? ( How do you try to see if it works )??

Bob Hansen spoke about the two projects that our group has been working on presently -

- 1). Construction of a park at the end of Waite Road south of Meade Road ( is an extension of Waite Road ) - currently no boat access from this site .
- 2). Upgrading of the existing boat launch just West of Waite Road again south of Meade Road. We would supply concrete slabs into the water and place gravel on the whole approach. The complete area will be compacted tightly and there would be a turn-around near the launch so that boaters would not have to back down all of the way from Meade Road. Parking would also be allowed on the sides of the ramp for tow vehicles and boat trailers.



On both of these projects the directors have viewed what has been developed at Deka Lake. They have a total of 22 Park/Picnic and Boat Launch Sites on their lake. Ministry of Transportation, Fisheries and Parks and Recreation have all viewed our initial detailed drawings that were presented to them and they are in support of our endeavor and willing to issue Land & Water use permits to allow us to proceed.

Currently there is no public Boat Launch site on the North side of Timothy Lake so anyone wishing to enter the lake must use the ramps of the private resorts such as Northwood and Marten's. ( Timothy Lake Resort is for sale so may not be available ) ??

We are currently searching for sources of funding to cover expenses required. It was suggested that a letter be written to state that members in attendance at this meeting support the project. Bill Rose is to look after this task.

Barbara Noiles spoke about "Required" liability insurance for the two projects. Deka Lake and District Ratepayers Association currently pays \$866.00 yearly for all of theirs. She is working with the insurance company that they are using.

B.C. Forestry Fire Mitigation Programs – Willi Breining and Mark Widsten attended a session on a Horse Lake Road site presented by Rob Martin – 100 Mile House Land and Resource Specialist.

Willi spoke about the areas visited showing their plans for tree spacing, clear cutting etc. They are clearing lands around and near communication towers as well. Communication in emergency has to be maintained.

They are planning also to work on Timothy Mountain and would like to approach residents to discuss and get their input on the project. Paul Blackwell suggested that we write a letter to Rob Martin to let him know that we are willing to participate and ask him to keep us posted as to when he needs to call a meeting?

Willi presented a map showing Timothy Lake and Greeny Lake areas where they intend to be working. He also has several photos of work performed in other areas.

Owen Wright spoke about the need to have a couple more directors for our group. With the projects happening currently there is a need for more help to do the required work load. We currently have President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and 3 Directors at large. Owen made a motion that we add two more Directors at large for a 1 year term, seconded by Bob Hansen. Carried.

#### Other New Business

Paul Blackwell spoke about a request from a resident on Timothy Lake Road to trap some Beavers on her property. He is unable to do this until October 15<sup>th</sup>. He is also doing work on Rail Lake, Murphy Lake and Greeny Lake. It is to late for Timothy Lake so he will add our name to the list he has for trapping. By law he can only trap from October 15<sup>th</sup> to May 31<sup>st</sup> ( no trapping from June 1<sup>st</sup> to October 14<sup>th</sup> ).

Director's Insurance – Owen Wright will be in contact with "Hub" in 100 Mile House to get rates for discussion.

The above funding is still available in our account as of this date. Please see bottom of page one of AGM minutes of June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

We were working with Mr. Falko Kadenbach of ABC Communications for him to supply all of the necessary equipment on Crown Land at the Southwest end of Timothy lake so we could get High Speed Internet Service for our area.

The project that we applied for to obtain Crown Land on which to install the tower was made on November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2007. After many meetings, changes of instructions and working on the many hurdles that was placed before us we decided to abandon our request on April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2013.


Our six page letter of cancellation was sent to our contact at Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and we copied Mr. Kadenbach of ABC Communications for his perusal. He asked for permission to forward a copy to his contact in Victoria at Network BC as he has five applications filed for two years and he was not getting any action as well. Within three months he had all of his applications approved.

A copy of this letter and their reply is available for your viewing if you would like?

At our Annual General Meeting on June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020 under "New Business" a discussion was held regarding possible construction of a Cell Tower so that our residents could get cell phone service for our area. Currently we do not have access to cell service, so in case of an emergency during a power failure, we have no contact with the outside world?

We would like to retain this funding to research and work with a cell phone provider to correct this dangerous situation. Please advise if this would be possible. Thanks in advance for your positive response.

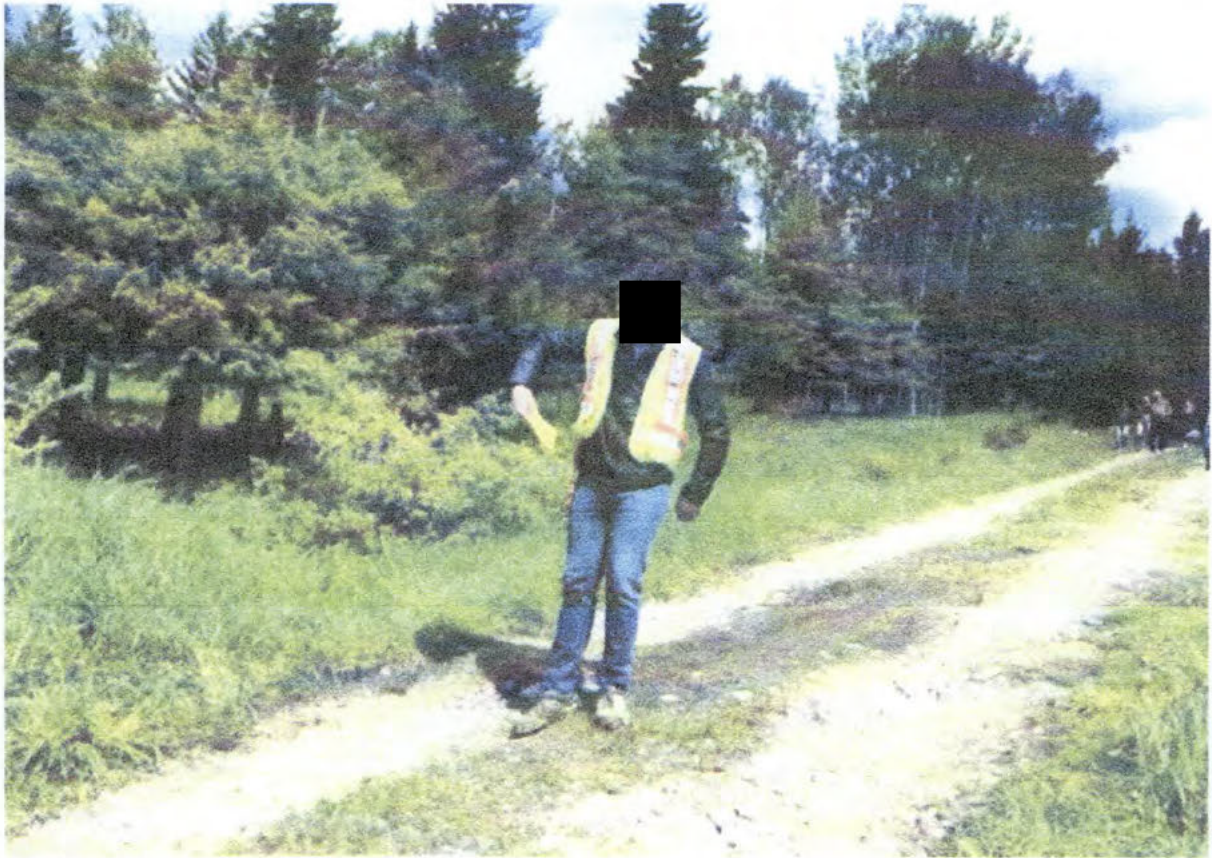


Figure 2 Acc #2

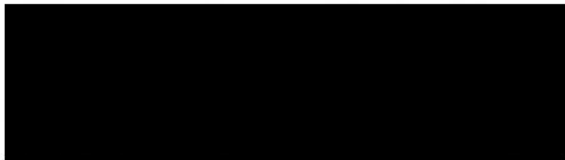

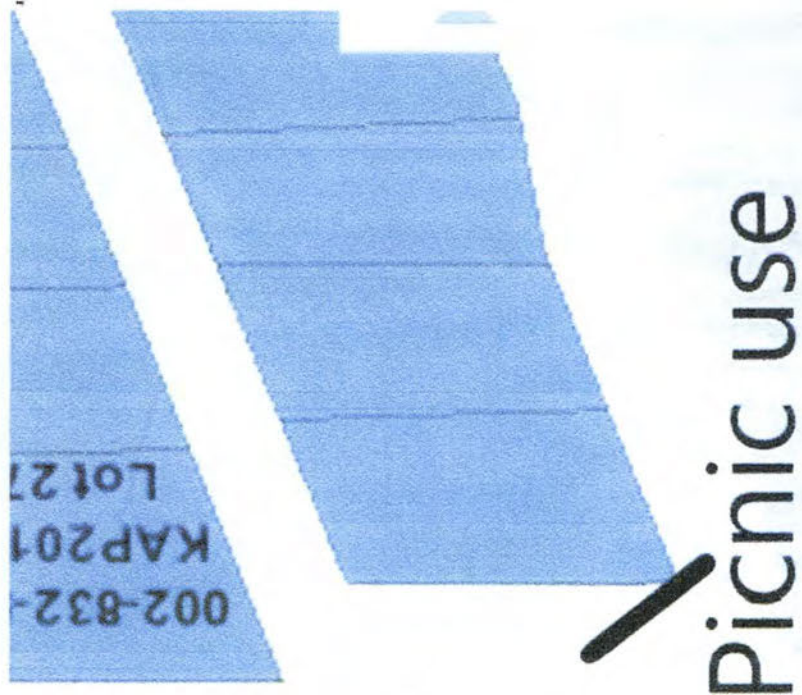
