Dear Chair and Directors:

This letter is to advise you that five geographical names, as detailed in Appendix A and shown on the attached map, have been adopted as official names in British Columbia. These names were proposed by Tŝilhqot'in National Government and supported by Cariboo Regional District, Rec Sites and Trails BC, Cariboo Mountain Bike Consortium, Avalanche Canada, BC Mountaineering Club, and the Association of Canadian Mountain Guides.

In accordance with the BC Geographical Naming Policy, local and Indigenous governments as well as relevant organizations were invited to comment on the proposed names, and bring forward local or heritage considerations and comments. The comment period ran from April 2019 – June 2020.

The BC Geographical Names Office acknowledges under the current circumstances, health, well-being, and precautionary measures are the priority of all British Columbians. These names were officially adopted 11 June 2020, but considering current events relating to COVID-19, implementation and notifications of these names were delayed to respect communication guidelines from many communities in British Columbia.

Official names are identified in the province's Geographical Names Gazetteer and in the BC Geographical Names Information System, and will be labelled on future editions of suitably-scaled provincial and federal government maps. Adoption of these names does not prejudice legitimate claims to the land.



Appendix A: Adopted Names

- 1. **?Eniyud** (pronounced Enni-yoot), formerly "Niut Mountain", adopted for the mountain located just east of the north end of Telhiqox Biny, north of the Homathko Icefield, in the Range 2 Coast Land District.
 - The name 'Niut' is an anglicization of "?Eniyud." Sometimes spelled "?Uniyud' (Advice from Tŝilhqot'in National Government, 2018).
 - According to Tŝilhqot'in legend, ?Eniyud was once a human woman married to a man named Tŝ'il?oŝ. When conflict drove them to separate, they and their children were turned to stone and became mountains. Today, both ?Eniyud and Tŝ'il?oŝ are considered powerful agents that protect and oversee their respective areas. Tŝilhqot'in teach that powerful mountains like ?Eniyud and Tŝ'il?oŝ should be shown great respect (i.e. do not point at or talk ill of them) (Advice from Tŝilhqot'in National Government 2020).
 - The peak of the mountain is located at: 51.63944, -124.525.

- Lhuy Nachasgwen Gunlin (pronounced Lhoo-ee Nachas-gwen Goo-leen), formerly "Eagle Lake," adopted for the lake located just south of Tatla Lake, north of Cochin Lake, in the Range 2 Coast Land District.
 - "Lhuy Nachasgwen Gunlin" is the Tŝilhqot'in name meaning "where there are many small fish" which refers to this lake as well as the wider area. Sometimes pronounced without a nasal 'n' as "Lhuy Nachasgwen Gulin" (Advice from Tŝilhqot'in National Government, 2018).
 - The centre of the lake is located at: 51.91306, -124.387.

- 3. **Tsalhanqox** (pronounced Tsah-lhan-koh), formerly "Chilanko River," adopted for the river that flows east into Little Chilcotin River, just east of Tŝideldel (Community), in the Range 3 Coast and Cariboo Land Districts.
 - The name Chilanko is an anglicization of "Tsalhanqox". (Advice from Tŝilhqot'in National Government, 2018).
 - "Tsalhanqox" is the Tŝilhqot'in name meaning "river with many beavers" from the Tŝilhqot'in words "Tsa" (beaver), "lhan" (many), and "yeqox" (creek/river) (Advice from Tŝilhqot'in National Government, 2018).
 - The mouth of the river is located at: 52.11528, -123.684.
 - Name Record: http://apps.gov.bc.ca/pub/bcgnws/names/70881.html
- Tsintŝanŝ XadalgwenIh (pronounced Tseen-tsoss Hadal-gwelh) adopted for a mountain located just northwest of Scum Lake, just west of Taseko River, in the Lillooet Land District.
 - Tŝilhqot'in name meaning 'mountain at Tsintŝanŝ.' There are a variety of opinions on spelling this name (Tŝintŝanŝ Xdg., Tsintŝans Xdg., & Tsintsanŝ Xdg. are also common). The name "Tsintŝanŝ" refers to a wider locality which includes Tsintŝanŝ Biny (Scum Lake). "Xadalgwenlh" means 'hill' or 'small mountain' (Advice from Tŝilhqot'in National Government 2020).
 - The peak of the mountain is located at: 51.80068, -123.622.

- 5. **Yuyehtah Biny** (pronounced Yu-yeh-tah Bee), formerly "Yohetta Lake," adopted for the lake located west of Taseko Lakes, east of Tŝilhqox Biny and south of Nemiah Valley, in the Lillooet Land District.
 - Yuyetah Biny is a Tŝilhqot'in name meaning 'lake at Yuyetah,' where "Yuyetah" is a
 proper noun referring to this area/valley, and "biny" means 'lake.' The spelling of
 the name 'Yohetta' is an anglicization of "Yuyetah." Sometimes spelled "Yuyahtah
 Biny" (Advice from Tŝilhqot'in National Government 2020). The centre of the lake is
 located at: 51.22944, -123.843.
