On behalf of the 44 members of the Lone Butte Historical Association, (LBHA) we would like to apply for a \$5,000 Grant for Assistance to complete the painting in Water Tower Park / Rest Station. This includes: the newly renovated washrooms inside and out, (two coats), sanding and staining the three log picnic tables (two coats), and painting the new fabricated metal stairs and hand rails, as well as the trim on the caboose museum. We hope to have Student Works Painting complete the project next spring or summer.

We used the last year's CRD \$5,000 grant for assistance to help pay for the new paint job on the Water Tower and the Speeder Shed. The tower and shed were painted by Student Works Painting, who did a good and expedient job. (see Free Press article attached). The total cost of the centennial project was \$5,812.45 which included the cost of the scissor lift rental.

Thanks to a \$2,500 grant from the South Cariboo Enhancement Foundation, we were able to open the washroom facilities to the public at the end of July for the remainder of the season. Due to COVID-19 we were unable to hold our usual fund raisers and were short \$2,500 to pay the increased janitorial costs, as the washrooms have to be cleaned twice a day.

In addition, in the future, when funds are available, we hope to purchase a lawn tractor, continue renovations to the old Lone Butte Post Office section and paint the Alice Singleton Heritage House, install continuous drain gutters and down spouts, as well as pouring a concrete sidewalk to the museum entrance.

We are very grateful for the CRD continued support.

This has been a very unusual year for us and many others. With the COVID 19 directing how we do our business, everything has changed.

We were unable to have any of our usual fund raisers and were only able to open the washroom facilities in the Water Tower Park, when we applied for a grant in the amount of \$2500 from the South Cariboo Community Enhancement Foundation. We got the washrooms open on July 29, thanks to the grant. The Park is closed due to Covid 19.

The Cariboo Regional District has once again given us aide from a grant for assistance in the amount of \$5000, which we applied for to paint the water tower on it's centennial year. The speeder shed got painted as well. The Student Works Painting group got the job done in two days in between rain storms, with two coats of hybrid oil paint. We are now in the third year of agreement with the C R D to assist with operating costs in the amount of \$3000 to cover costs such as insurance, supplies and hydro bills in Water Tower Park. We hope to enter into a new agreement with the C R D this Fall for another three years. We will apply for another grant for assistance for next year to paint the washroom facilities, the caboose stairs and oiling the three picnic tables.

We have plans to set up a facsimile of the old post office and a hospital room in the Alice Singleton Heritage House. We acquired on old hospital bed from Rolande Perron, in Lac La Hache. We have nurses uniforms, bed pan, and old medical supplies and bottles.

The Lone Butte Pioneer Cemetery fence was painted with two coats of paint by the Lone Butte 4-H Club. The grounds still need work with the small poplar trees being cut down.

We are down on our membership numbers. Please come and join with us in trying to keep the Historical Association and the history of Lone Butte and area going. We would be very happy to see new, younger members join with us 'old timers' and get our association thriving again.

Water Tower Park - We had a letter from B C Hydro in February telling us that they wanted to change the meter in the park. Gayle called them and told them there was a lot of snow against the gate and that they couldn't get in at that time. He said that was OK, they would do it at a different time. We never heard from them again. The bathrooms were finally opened on July 29, due to the COVID - 19 virus. This was only possible because Al applied for and got a grant from the South Cariboo Enhancement Foundation for \$2500. This helped us to pay Dawn Moore's wage, get supplies for the bathrooms, fencing for the park to separate the bathrooms from the rest of the park, which remained closed all season and new soap dispensers with hand sanitizer. Al got the C R D grant for assistance of \$5000 to paint the 100 year old tower and the speeder shed. We also got an operational grant of \$3000 for the park. Student Works Painting got the bid to paint the tower and speeder shed, which they did in 2 days with 17 gallons of paint, 5 girls painting, two spray guns and a lift. Al will apply for another grant for assistance asking to do the second phase of painting the bathroom inside and out, railing, stairs, doors and trim on the Caboose, the big toy, 3 picnic tables, the stage and the garbage box.
