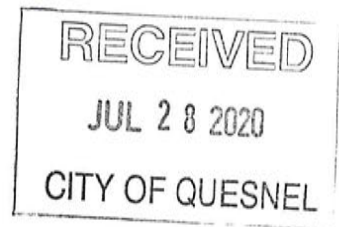
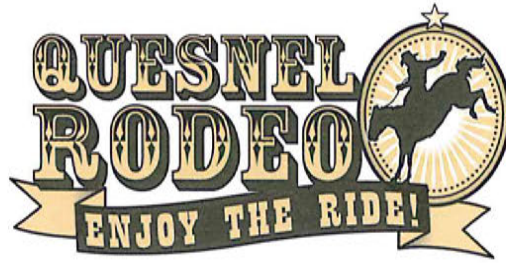
I am writing to you today as a follow up to a letter sent to you July 20, 2020 in regards to Gus Cameron.
