## **Short Summary:**

Williams Lake Curling Club Community Works Funding (CWF) Project and Enabling Agreement

#### **Voting:**

Corporate Vote - Weighted

#### Memorandum:

Please find attached a financial request from the Williams Lake Curling Club, to the Cariboo Regional District. The request is up to \$25,500 to perform lighting, heating and hot water tank upgrades at the Williams Lake Curling Arena.

The lighting upgrade will involve replacing current lights with LEDs in the lobby and upper lounge areas. The lighting upgrade is expected to result in savings of approximately 7,500 KWH/year.

The heating upgrade will involve replacing two old rink unit heaters with a more energy efficient model, and replacing electric space heaters and electric pipe tape with energy efficient gas radiant heating units. The heating upgrade is expected to result in savings of approximately 5,200 KWH/year.

The hot water tank upgrade will involve replacing the current 40-gallon hot water tank with an "on-demand" system. This upgrade is expected to result in savings of approximately 1,800 KWH/year.

Because the curling arena is not owned by the CRD, a contribution agreement between the Regional District and the Williams Lake Curling Club is required for this project by UBCM under its Gas Tax Sharing Master Agreement with the federal government. Under the terms of the agreement, the community group is responsible for managing the project, maintaining financial records, reporting on measurable results and retaining ownership of the asset for a minimum of 10 years.

## **Financial Implications:**

The proposal from the Williams Lake Curling Club requests up to \$25,500 from the Community Hall Improvements envelope of the 2019 CWF program.

The Board approved the CWF funding schedule for 2019, including the Community Hall Improvements envelope which currently has a total of \$51,700 available. If this application from the Williams Lake Curling Club is approved, \$25,500 will be committed, leaving a balance of \$26,200 available for community hall projects.

# **Policy Implications:**

None. The Board approved the CWF funding schedule for 2019, including the Community Hall Improvements envelope. This project meets CWF criteria for the upgrade of lighting and heating for energy efficiency.
