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The 3rd Annual South Cariboo Summer Festival Final Report

The South Cariboo Summer Festival was held again at the South Cariboo Re Centre and Grounds on August 10th & 11th. The weather was nice for all of Saturday and most of Sunday. The committee was quite happy with the estimated 1200 people through the gate. We had the assistance and support from 25volunteers during the festival's two days.

Saturday the 10th, started off with the returning Wranglers Pancake Breakfast just outside the doors of the arena. Saturday continued with nice weather and the crowds where moving consistently. As decided at the wrap of last year's event we condensed the areas of the event so that it could be utilized better for the attendees. Our trade faire was held indoors again in the arena and was the placer about 25 vendors.

Outside we had return Tom Jennings and his team of Percherons and their wagon. Maverick Farms petting zoo and pony rides which was a big hit once again. Uncle Chris the Clown in the Kids Zone, Big Horn Archery and the loved Schutzhund group with demonstrations both Saturday and Sunday. The excitement for the returning Lawn Mower Races brought a great crowd over to the edge of the ball field, to cheer on the drivers. Returned where 11 racers the competed on both days and put on a great show for all of us to see.

Just outside the Rec centre our 4 food vendors spread our over the parking lot to feed all the attendees. The snells where Devine and the vendors all reported having good sales Saturday with slightly less sales Sunday due to the cooler temperatures.

Some new fun aspects where added to the Summer Festival this year, they where well received and attended. Firstly being the Kids Firefighter Challenge that was put on by the 100 Mile House Fire Rescue and their team of volunteers. Saturday was well attended with an estimate of over 100 children 12 & Under through the course. Sunday brought about 60 children through due to the cooler temperatures. Another big hit which was also done by the same group was the Vehicle extraction demonstrations that where demonstrated both Saturday and Sunday. Two vehicles where donated and transported for the Fire Rescue team to show the crowd two different scenarios that they encounter with vehicle incidents.

With those two new portions of the event a success we had high hopes that where validated when the Cariboo Chit Chat Club presented their Kids Pie Eating Contest on Saturday and Celebrity Pie Eating Contest on Sunday! Both heavily attended with the crowds cheering on the pie eaters, watching to see who the big winners ended up being.



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Our main stage brought a constant line up of entertainment with the Kordaroy Band, Dutch Courage returning, Uncle Chris the Clown, the Baladi Babes and Madison Olds, although her set was interrupted by mother nature we continued into Sunday and enjoyed every moment.

The committee has some changes and improvements for the 4th Annual Summer Festival that we hope to expand on the great aspect and downsize or eliminate any areas that aren't fitting in with the event well.

All in all we call this another successful event, that we where happy to all be apart of and have such a great committee and group of volunteers by our sides. The amount of community attendance shows that the event is still relevant and we will once again focus on the positives and bringing more of that excitement forward in the future.
