

2020 in Review: Tonnes of Waste Landfilled


Total Tonnes CRD's 3 Regional Landfills




- During the last SWMP the disposal rate was 775 kg/person

- As of 2019 the rate was 631 kg/person




2020 in Review: Tonnes of Recyclables

2021 What to Expect: SWMP Update

- Advisory Committee (SWAC) has been formed.
- SWAC has Public (PAC) and Technical (TAC) members, TAC are non-voting (as per the MoECCS guidance document for Solid Waste Mgt Planning).
- Currently there are 9 PAC members and 12 TAC members.
- The Chair of the Board Solid Waste Management Committee (BSWMC), is one of the PAC members and will be the liaison between the two committees.

2021 What to Expect: SWMP Update Con't

- Local Government (LG) Staff are TAC members, and are tasked with providing the PAC members with compelling data/justification for the services/objectives/ strategies/policies that each LG has a vested interest in.
- The TAC members will be asked to report on these items early in the process to ensure that the public consultation process prepares residents and provides survey results for the SWAC to consider.
- CRD Board members with specific input for services/objectives/ strategies/policies that they would like to see the LG TAC members bring forward should be in communication with their LG Staff. (FYI: Power supply for rural refuse sites is already on the list of items for discussion.)



2021 What to Expect: Fire Smart

- The free disposal of fire abatement wood waste from Cariboo properties was scheduled to wrap up on May 31st of 2021.
- The Canadian Red Cross Services (CRCS) has agreed to extend the Fire Smart wood waste funding until the end of November of 2021.
- Communication to residents regarding the new end date will be extensive to ensure everyone has an opportunity to dispose of their hazard wood waste for free.



2021 What to Expect: Transtor Bin Replacement

- Starting this spring the following bins will be replaced:
 - Horsefly (2)
 - Baker Creek (2)
 - Riske Creek (1)
 - Cottonwood (1)
 - Eagle Creek (1)
- The Chimney and McLeese sites will be evaluated this year to determine if room can be made for two bins, if it is feasible, the site construction and installation of new bins will occur in 2022.
