 - Recognized for outstanding achievement in mine reclamation, research, and Indigenous collaboration.

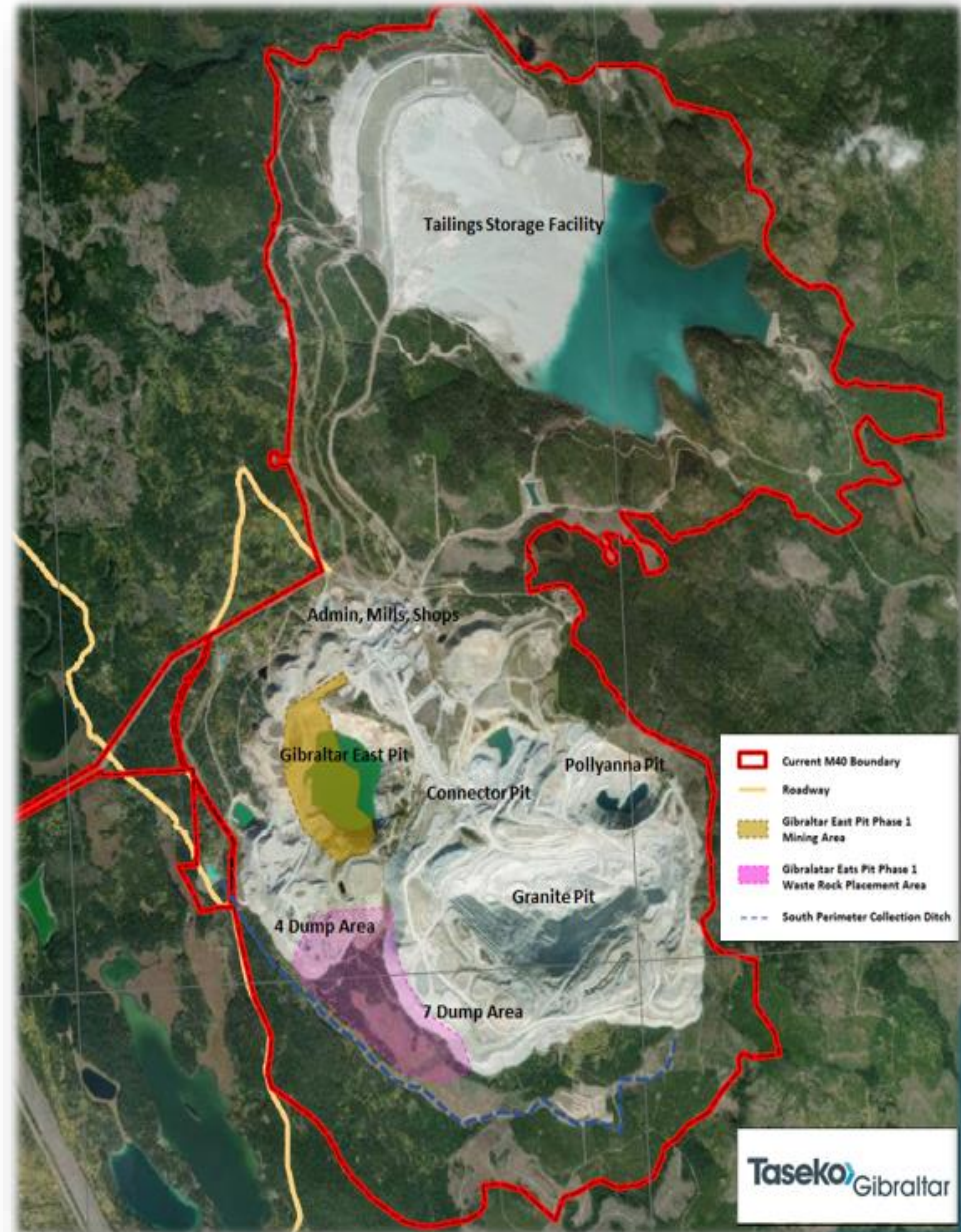


Continue to successfully operate through COVID-19

- Education

- Current mining operation focused in Pollyanna Pit.
- Permit application submitted to continue mining in Gibraltar East Pit.
 - The application is a simple change in mining sequence within the current permit boundary and involves the movement of water from Gibraltar East Pit to Granite Pit.
- Layoff notices to 34 employees effective April 27, 2021 due to delays in permitting.
- Permit expected by mid-late-May and employees will be recalled.



- **Site continues to operate with positive water balance.**
 - TSF Volume of Water: ~40 million m³.



- **Amended permit P-416 for temporary increased discharge to the Fraser River received on March 19, 2019 (valid to November 2021).**
 - Discharge rate increased from 0.190 m³/s to 0.285 m³/s
- **Phase 4 Environmental Effects Monitoring (EEM) study and report submitted December 2020 and reviewed by TAC – no adverse effects.**
- **Water Treatment Plant**
 - Detailed design works underway.
 - Plan to initiate permitting process this year.
- **Continue to work on water alternative options**
 - Active and Passive water treatment.
 - Proportional/seasonal discharge.
 - Discharge to streams adjacent to Mine Site.



- **Mining Month Celebrations**
 - Recognize and celebrate the importance of mining in BC.
- **High School Scrap Steel Program**
 - Steel is given to Lake City Secondary metal work/welding students to work with on class projects.
- **COVID-19 Community Safety**
 - Gibraltar has donated PPE and masks to Interior Health, Xat'sül First Nation, ?Esdilagh First Nation, and Williams Lake First Nation.
- **2021 Salmon Sampling Program**
 - Working with local Indigenous groups since 2016.
- **2020 Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) Report**
 - Released April 2021
