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COVID-19

Provincial case counts and statements

As of April 21, **6,869** cases have been reported in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic.

- Cases currently active: **232**
- New cases: **31**
- Currently in hospital: **18**
- Currently in ICU-level care in hospital: **9**
- Deaths in the region since the beginning of the pandemic: **136**

This page is updated regularly and has the current immunization schedule developed for the North, in partnership with the First Nations Health Authority, Métis Nation BC, and Northern Health.

BC residents are facing new COVID-19 restrictions as the province works to reduce the current levels of transmission of the virus. The new orders will include restricting vacation and recreational travel outside of individual health authorities and are expected to be put in place later this week under the Emergency Program Act.

Current restrictions on pubs, bars, restaurants, and group fitness activities, as well as the Expedited Workplace Closure order, will be extended through to May 24, 2021 at midnight.

Province now vaccinating people in high-transmission neighbourhoods

The vaccine strategy in BC is being shifted to include communities with high transmissions, focussing on neighbourhoods in Fraser Health, Vancouver Coastal Health and Northern Health.

The new strategy will focus on people born in 1981 and earlier who are 40 years and older, and who will be vaccinated primarily with the AstraZeneca vaccine.

Monitoring and testing is underway to identify any additional cases.

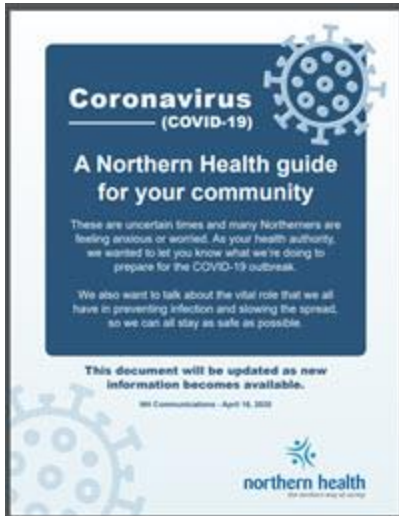

Five years of the overdose crisis in BC

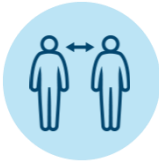
