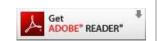

Please explain why your project is needed in your community.

The Miocene Community Hall, built in 1972, has been a well maintained structure and has acted as an anchor for community activity. This community has taken pride in maintaining and upgrading the facility, the only community structure in the area. Over the last few years, the Community organization has upgraded the kitchen facilities to 'commercial kitchen status', and has maintained the facade, washrooms, and grounds to a high spec. The last piece is to tackle the flooring which has been maintained in a patchwork format. This includes three types of lino with potential tripping hazards including open seams in the kitchen and entry hall. Repairing in a piecemeal fashion is no longer an option The entire floor needs to be replaced from one side of the building to the other with commercial grade flooring. This new flooring will create a long lasting, smooth seamless surface, requiring little to no maintenance, and will look fresh and new.

With safe flooring and a fresh look, this facility will be available for community events, including fundraising opportunities, as well as rental for events. Once Covid-19 health conditions allow this will be the perfect type of venue for increasingly popular rural weddings and events. Also with the influx of residents purchasing rural Cariboo properties use of the facility, including rentals, is expected to increase.

Miocene is an inclusive community focused on supporting each other. The Hall acts as a gathering place for community functions like dances, socials, and an internet cafe, and is home to a large and thriving 4H club, a large community garden, and a sports field, children's playground, and tennis courts. With new families moving to the area, and the rural nature of the community, a central space is key to exclusivity, gathering, and sharing.

Will this project enhance the physical appearance, character, or natural environment in the community? If so, please explain

The entire scope of the project is inside the hall. Wall to wall flooring will enhance the look and feel inside the hall and will likely attract additional functions and rentals.

Will the completion of the project will result in reduced operation, maintenance and related costs over the life-cycle of the asset? If so, please explain

Wall to wall commercial grade flooring is long lasting and requires little to no maintenance. Currently, upgrades and maintenance is needed annually, and through out the season. Upon each use, work is needed to ensure seams between the patchwork flooring does not act as a tripping hazard.

By reducing the tripping hazards between the seams of flooring this facility becomes more accessible to those with mobility issues.

Currently, the main safety concern is tripping hazards along seams of flooring. As flooring continues to deteriorate these tripping hazards increase. By replacing all of the flooring with industrial grade flooring all tripping hazards will be removed.

Covid-19 has motivated rural migration. New residents used to city lifestyles expect gathering places and a certain level of community. Miocene Community Hall and the surrounding grounds act as a gathering place for the rural residents of the Miocene area.

The Miocene Hall is used by all aspects of the community. With many events including dances, dinners, breakfasts, weddings, and reunions, it attracts people of all ages and socioeconomic backgrounds.
