Dear Directors;

On behalf of the 100 Mile House Curling Club, I would like to thank you for your continued support. Your support and the hard work of our volunteers allow us to provide an affordable recreation opportunity to all the people of the South Cariboo. I would also like to thank Darron Campbell and Josh Dickerson and the staff at the South Cariboo Recreation Center. Their cooperation plays an essential part in the successful operation of our club.

I have included with this letter a copy of our five-year plan and a report on our activities and achievements for the 2020 – 2021 curling season. The five-year plan is designed to maintain our goal of spending excess revenue on the maintenance and improvement of the curling rink while continuing to maintain a solid financial position. With this objective in mind, we have put our five-year plan on hold until we know if and/or when and under what conditions we will be allowed to return to curling. We curled for eight weeks in October, November and December of 2020. If we are able to return to curling for a full season and our support remains stable, we would like to proceed with the water treatment project indicated in our five-year plan. Installing a water treatment system is now cost effective as the new deep well water supply requires more treatment reducing the payback time

on a new system to under eight years. Our current system uses tanks that must be sent away for servicing twice a year. The previous surface water required the tanks to be serviced once every two years. If you are able to share a portion of the cost of the new system, it would enable the club to proceed earlier than currently planned. The club would like to request that an inspection of the decorative masonry blocks near the main entrance be made. It appears that some of the blocks are coming loose and beginning to fall away from the main structure.

The 100 Mile House Curling Club is looking forward to being able to return to curling in the fall of 2021 in cooperation with the Cariboo Regional District. We will, of course follow whatever guidelines are set by the Cariboo Regional District and the Provincial Health Officer.
