Public Consultation Summary & Land Use Concurrence Request

SitePath Consulting Ltd. ("SitePath") is representing TELUS Communications Inc. ("TELUS") in seeking land use concurrence from the Cariboo Regional District in response to a proposed telecommunications installation.

Objective

- TELUS has been receiving longstanding requests for wireless service improvements in the areas surrounding Watch Lake and Green Lake. As a result, TELUS is proposing to install a communication site on privately-owned land at 6235 Green Lake North Road to enable enhanced wireless service.
- The proposed facility will provide dependable voice and data service to the Watch Lake community and improve personal safety as the majority of emergency calls are made using wireless devices.

Description of Proposed Site

- TELUS is proposing the construction of a 63.1-meter tall self-support tower on a privately-owned property at 6235 Green Lake North Road near Watch Lake in the Cariboo Regional District. The approximate coordinates of the tower are as follows: 51.449820, -121.151657.
- If constructed, all of the equipment necessary to operate this facility will reside within an approximately 15.0 meter by 15.0 meter fenced compound located at the base of the tower.
- The subject property was selected for the following reasons:
 - **Sight Lines:** The proposed tower location will achieve excellent sight lines over the intended service areas and enable TELUS to tie the site into its network. The adjacent residential areas will receive dependable service.
 - Large Lot Size: The subject property is a large 80.9 acre lot thereby enabling reasonable setbacks from adjacent residences and land uses.
 - Access: Access is achievable via an existing road and a small access driveway that will extend into TELUS' compound.
 - **Power:** Existing overhead power is available on the subject property and can be extended into TELUS' compound with minimal impacts on the land.

Existing Structures

• TELUS has reviewed all existing structures within the search area and has confirmed that there are no existing antenna-support structures of a suitable height or location that would provide dependable network improvements in the community.

Visibility

- The proposed tower may be visible from surrounding residential areas.
- Due to mature adjacent trees, TELUS anticipates that from numerous vantage points only the lower portion of the tower will be visible.
- TELUS is proposing a self-support tower structure instead of a guyed tower, thereby minimizing visual impacts to the extent possible as there will be no guy wires.

Consultation Process & Summary

Innovation, Science and Economic Development (ISED) Canada Default Consultation Process

As the CRD does not have an established and documented public consultation process applicable to tower siting on private land, TELUS was required to follow the ISED Public Consultation Process as follows:

- Notify any property owners within three times the proposed tower height: Due to large lot sizes in the subject notification radius, there were only two (2) lots within the radius including crown land and one private property. TELUS shared the address list with CRD staff prior to proceeding to ensure a suitable notification.
- Place a notice in a local paper welcoming public comments within the prescribed timelines: TELUS placed a notice for two issues in the 100 Mile House Free Press publication. The notices were posted on July 29th and August 5th, 2021. Please refer to **Appendix A** for copies of the newspaper notices.
- **Request land use concurrence from the relevant land use authority:** TELUS is now seeking land use concurrence from the CRD in order to complete ISED's consultation requirements.

Consultation Summary

During the public consultation process, TELUS received comments directly from five (5) community members. Of the comments directly received, only one (1) stated concerns and they specifically noted that they oppose the installation and moved away from an urban area to get away from such infrastructure. Four (4) commenters indicated support for the proposed tower and expressed a general need to improve service. TELUS also received a *petition in support* of the proposed tower with approximately one hundred and forty-four (144) signatures on it. Redacted copies of all of the comments received including the supportive petition can be found in **Appendix B** of this document.

Land Use Concurrence Request

Although TELUS is exclusively regulated by the Federal Government, ISED requires TELUS to consult with the relevant land use authority as a commenting body in the siting of antenna support structures. As a form of comment, TELUS is requesting land use concurrence from the CRD in the form of a resolution or a letter that addresses the following items:

- The Cariboo Regional District is satisfied with TELUS' consultation process, as outlined in ISED's Default Public Consultation Process;
- That the proposed tower is a permitted use;
- The proposed design and location is acceptable;
- That the Cariboo Regional District is has been consulted and concurs with the tower location.

Hi Michelle:

Thanks for letting us know. Below is some feedback.

- At this time, we are planning 4G/LTE on this tower as is the case in most similar communities. 5G is a future technology across all wireless networks globally so one can anticipate that however timelines are to be determined. These technologies are operating in many communities already, delivering critical services in a safe manner. One can anticipate that 5G will be rolled out in the near future.

- Our cell sites are low powered and only require a 200 amp hydro feed (including buffer room for future needs) and in many cases as little as 60 amps (i.e. comparable to a clothes dryer you may find in most peoples' homes). A 200 amp service is the level of service that is typically delivered to most modern single family homes as a reference point yet our facility would serve hundreds of people.

- Regarding health and safety, as you may know, the wireless carriers are obligated to comply with Health Canada's safety code known as Safety Code 6 and this code regulates all radiofrequency emitting infrastructure (e.g. baby monitors, wi-fi routers, cell phones, radio towers, cell sites etc). Below are some helpful links that we often share and attached is a useful literature review from the Chief Medical Health Officer at the Vancouver Coastal Health Authority. In sum, the infrastructure will operate safely as long as we adhere to the safety code as is legally required.

- I often point out that there are many cell sites in urban areas where health indicators are often better than rural areas that lack the infrastructure. For example, Richmond, BC has the longest average life expectancy in BC year over year despite being home to many cell sites, an international airport and many other technologies and infrastructure types that come with urban living. How, then, do some people conclude that cell sites are the root cause of health issues if places with many cell sites like Richmond and Vancouver have long life expectancies and an abundance of infrastructure? This is food for thought on a complex matter.

I understand your feedback and sincerely appreciate it. Ultimately, TELUS is legally required to comply with the Health Canada Safety Code. We are not able to influence the code and if you have concerns about the safety code you may wish to inquire directly with Health Canada as they are the relevant policy maker.

Watch Lake North Green Lake is a vibrant rural community approximately 30 kilometres southeast from the town of 100 Mile House in the Cariboo Regional District. The members of our community are a blend of full-time residents and seasonal and part-time residents. There are also several resorts for vacationers, a Provincial Park with camping and day use, as well as many fishers and outdoor enthusiast enjoying both lakes and the area that surrounds us.

The demography of the area is somewhat varied, with many full-time residents being older and retired. And there are more folks retiring to the community every year. There are also younger families here and more families have been settling in the area over the past few years. The community is growing with permanent residents. Those who live here all year, as well as those who have cabins and homes seasonally, also bring visitors and family to the community. The visitors inevitably rely on their cell phones.

Many full-time residents have landlines but not all, most part-time and seasonal residents do not. Visitors to the area have only cell phones. Those who rely on their cell phones must find a "sweet spot" to use the phone, the calls often drop, and generally there is only one bar. When travelling around our community, or to and from town, there is very little cellular service and one must rely on being in a "sweet spot". All visitors to the park and the resorts rely on their cell phones.

The lack of reliable cellular service is a major concern for a number of reasons. Our community often has power outages due to falling trees in seasonal storms, windstorms and other harsh weather conditions. While a few of us with landlines have access to older phones to plug-in, in case an emergency should arrive, most do not. For many seniors, and families with small children, this is a safety concern.

With rural distances, in the event of an accident or vehicle break down, especially in the winter months, having only sporadic service becomes a major concern, again especially for seniors and those with small children.

With the growth of our community there are now residents who are working remotely, with there business based from home. There are a variety of businesses including consultants, trades people and others. While in the field, and some at home, they rely on cellular service.

GRINVER BUSINESS

To ensure the success of the proposed telecommunications facility to provide cellular service within our growing community, we have provided a signed petition to support this proposal. While we have many names and signatures, many who are seasonal or part-time were unable to sign, as they were currently not at their residence. We are confident however, that most would sign and support the proposed service if they were here, as most rely on cellular service when they are here.
