The following members were present: Hazel, Shelley, Doreen, Joyce, Rene, Sandra, Olang, Jean, Celeste, Arlene, Celia, Marion, Linda, Diane, Anne & Susan.

Linda called the meeting to order at 10:10am with16 members present.

The secretary read the minutes of the AGM held Sept 9th, 2020. Doreen moved & Rene seconded that the minutes be adopted as read.

Treasurers report was read by Diane who presented a comprehensive financial report for the period of Sept 1,2020 to June 30,2021. We have \$11,557.47 cash on hand Jean moved and Arlene seconded that the treasurers report be adopted as presented. Carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Celeste motioned that we not have the quilt show in 2022 and reaccess it again at the next AGM in 2022. Jean seconded. All in favour except Doreen who abstained.

NEW BUSINESS:

Celia brought up the fact that we are all out of the labels for our community quilts. She had some samples of some labels that she had found. We had a choice of 250 for \$60 or 500 for \$100.

Celia motioned that we order the 500 for \$100 with printed font and hearts in white and red colours. Olang seconded. All in favour. Carried.

Celeste will take a photo of the preemie quilts and talk to Diane Forester about putting it in her column. Also she will draft a letter about who our sponsors are.

In the fall we need to promote Log Cabin Quilters to encourage new members to

join.

The guidelines were discussed and it was decided that we needed to make a change. Hazel motioned that executive positions are for a term of two years but you can hold that position for as long as you like as long as there is nobody willing to apply for that position. Doreen seconded. Carried

Celeste mentioned that if members want to display any small quilting projects that they can talk to the new librarian.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Community Quilts: Hazel reported that we have 5 youth, 5small, and 9 large

Librarian; Rene reported that she had gotten rid of some old books. Basically working on the honour system for people returning borrowed books.

Photographer/Blogger: Celeste reported that we had 49 Facebook members/ followers. Members are encouraged to post quilting related items and photos.

Art Council: Rene had nothing new to report.

Chemo Quilt Coordinator: Celia reported that 191 quilts had been donated since 2014. This year 24 donated. On hand 7 youth, 18 women, and 11 men.

Preemie Quilt Coordinator: Marion reported that we have 26 on hand. Optimum size 36"x36". Jean has been working on putting new kits together.

Christmas Party: There was party in 2020 due to covid.




