

# REFERENDUM 2022 - PROPOSED NEW RECREATION & CULTURE SERVICE



## Proposed Changes for South Cariboo Recreation & Culture Service

## QUICK FACTS

### WHAT WOULD THIS SERVICE INCLUDE?

The proposed new service will pay for existing South Cariboo Recreation & Culture services, plus include the ability to pursue a new major project, such as an aquatic facility.

### WHO WOULD THIS SERVICE INCLUDE?

The new service will include all of CRD Electoral Areas G, H, L, and the District of 100 Mile House.

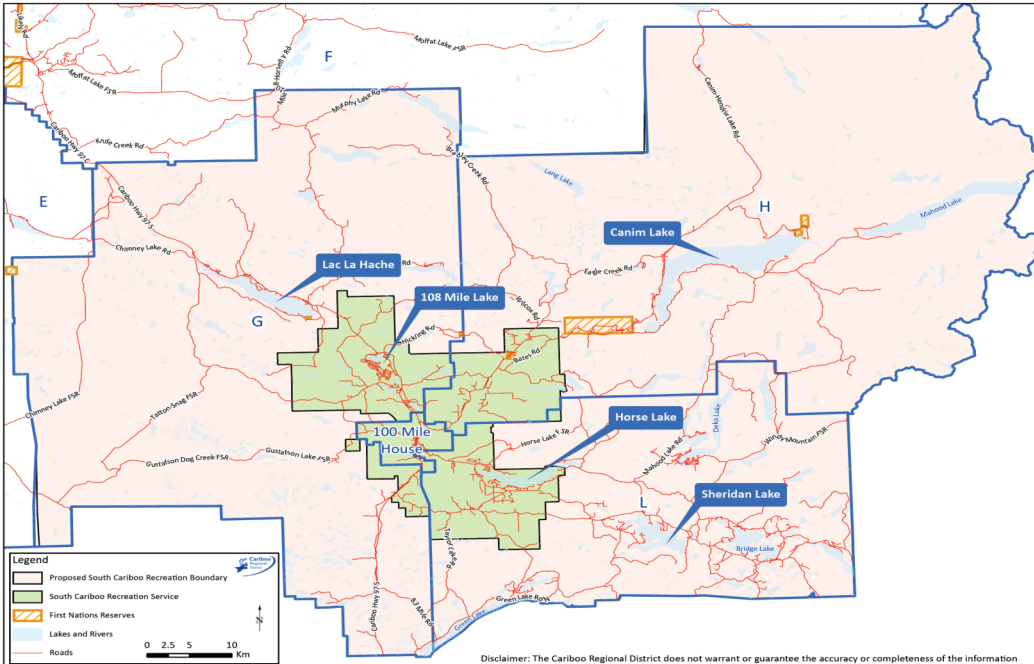
### WHAT WOULD THEY PAY?

The proposed annual taxation limit is \$3.75 million. Under the new service, the CRD would seek permission for a new residential rate of up to \$100 per \$100,000 for all Area G, H, L, and 100 Mile area properties.

### WHEN IS THE REFERENDUM?

A referendum is planned for 2022. All eligible Area G, H, L, and 100 Mile House residents and property owners will be able to vote.

If the proposed new service referendum passes, it will be in place for 2023. The taxation rate will continue to reflect only the cost of existing services. Any significant increase in taxation would take place if and when an aquatic centre or other major facility is constructed and in operation.



### What is proposed?

The CRD is proposing to create a new South Cariboo Recreation and Culture service that includes all of South Cariboo Electoral Areas G, H, L, and the District of 100 Mile House.

### How does the proposed service compare to similar service functions in the region?

### Why establish a new service rather than expand the existing one?

Based on feedback from the public during initial consultation, the South Cariboo Joint Committee heard that the proposed service needed to include the potential for a major new recreation facility, such as an aquatic centre.

A new service is required in order to accommodate the construction and operation of a major project that would provide benefits to all areas of the South Cariboo. The new service would replace the current South Cariboo Recreation and Culture service.
