Short Summary:

Cariboo Regional District Water Rates Bylaw No. 5363, 2022

Memorandum:

User fees for the Lac La Hache Water Utility show a 10% increase from \$206 in 2021 to \$226 in 2022. The SCADA system upgrade, new well and pumphouse and other minor capital works are primary reasons for this fee increase.

User fees for the Forest Grove Water Utility show a 5% increase from \$294 in 2021 to \$309 in 2022. The SCADA system upgrade and other minor capital works are primary reasons for this fee increase.

User fees for the Alexis Creek Water Utility show a 26.9% increase from \$394 in 2021 to \$500 in 2022. The SCADA system upgrade, new well and pumphouse and other minor capital works are primary reasons for this fee increase.

User fees for the Central Alexis Creek Water Utility show a 4.25% increase from \$480 in 2021 to \$500 in 2022. The SCADA system upgrade, new well and pumphouse and other minor capital works are primary reasons for this fee increase.

User fees for the Horse Lake Water Utility show a 5% increase from \$250 in 2021 to \$263 in 2022. The SCADA system upgrade and other minor capital works are primary reasons for this fee increase.

User fees for the 103 Mile Water Utility show a 7.5% increase from \$300 in 2021 to \$322 in 2022. The SCADA system upgrade and other minor capital works are primary reasons for this fee increase.

Bylaw No. 5363 is hereby presented for consideration of three readings and adoption to enable the fee increases.
