Re: TELUS Request for Land Use Concurrence (TELUS File: BC109200 – Watch Lake)

Dear Mr. Whitehead:

Further to our prior discussions, TELUS is planning to deliver improved wireless service in the vicinity of Watch Lake. In order to enable reliable service, TELUS is proposing to install a new 63.0-meter tall self-support tower at 6303 Pioneer Road, Watch Lake, BC V0K 2K1. The subject property is home to the Watch Lake-North Green Lake Volunteer Fire Department. The proposed facility is to be located on a lot with proximity to existing access and power lines. The tower, if constructed, will provide improved wireless service to the rural residential areas in Watch Lake and Green Lake as well as along segments of adjacent roadways in support of public safety.

As context, TELUS respectfully notes that it previously received land use concurrence via the CRD for a prior proposed tower location in the same general area, however due to unforeseen design challenges TELUS opted to relocate the proposed tower to the subject fire hall property.

In order to move forward with the revised proposed tower location, as the CRD does not have an established and documented public consultation process applicable to tower siting on private land, TELUS was required to consult the Watch Lake community in accordance with the Innovation, Science and Economic Development (ISED) Canada Default Process. This process entails the completion of a public notice in a local newspaper, a mail-out to area property owners and occupants within a radius of three times the proposed tower height and concludes with a request for a letter of land use concurrence from the CRD. A copy of the public consultation package and newspaper notices are enclosed for your reference (*refer to Appendix A and B*). During the consultation process, TELUS received only two (2) public comments. The first comment included a request for TELUS to clear its compound so that it is easier to protect in the event of a wildfire scenario. This commenter also stated a preference for TELUS to mark the tower to ensure aeronautical safety. The second commenter indicated general support for the proposal. Copies of all public comments and TELUS' responses are enclosed in *Appendix C*. TELUS also previously received a petition in support of this wireless service upgrade for the prior proposed tower location and a copy of that petition can be found in *Appendix D*. Based on the foregoing, TELUS respectfully requests a motion or letter of land use concurrence that addresses the following items:

- *That the Cariboo Regional District is satisfied with TELUS' consultation process, as outlined in ISED's Default Public Consultation Process;*
- *That the proposed tower is a permitted use;*
- *The proposed design and location is acceptable;*
- *That the Cariboo Regional District has been consulted and concurs with the tower location.*

Wireless technology offers many benefits to Canadians. Millions of individuals rely on wireless communications to enhance their personal security and safety, enjoy more frequent contact with family, friends and business associates, and to make more productive use of their personal and professional time. Additionally, cellular coverage improves public safety as over 80 percent of all calls to 911 are placed through wireless devices.

TELUS' Proposal

TELUS is proposing to construct a 63.0-meter tall self-support tower at 6303 Pioneer Road, Watch Lake, BC V0K 2K1. The subject property is home to the Watch Lake-North Green Lake Volunteer Fire Department and is located within the Cariboo Regional District. All the equipment necessary to operate this facility will reside within a compound located at the base of the tower. The tower, if constructed, will provide improved wireless service to the rural residential areas in Watch Lake and Green Lake as well as along segments of adjacent roadways in support of public safety.

Authority

Although Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada (ISED) has exclusive jurisdiction over the placement of wireless telecommunications facilities, it requires the carriers to consult with the applicable local government and the general public regarding new installations. The public consultation process is intended to provide an opportunity to have property owner questions addressed while respecting federal jurisdiction over the installation and operation of telecommunications systems.

ISED's Default Public Consultation

As the Cariboo Regional District does not have an established and documented public consultation process applicable to tower siting on privately-owned land, TELUS is required to follow the ISED (formerly Industry Canada) Default Public Consultation Process. ISED has jurisdiction over telecommunications facilities and has set out public and land use authority consultation requirements in the ISED circular, CPC-2-0-03 (CPC) for telecommunication carriers. The CPC requires TELUS to consult with the local land use authority and the general public. TELUS is also required to provide notification packages to property owners within a radius of three times the proposed tower height, measured from the tower base or the outside perimeter of the supporting structure. The required notification radius in this instance is 189.0 meters. Your property falls within this notification radius, and accordingly, TELUS is consulting with you on this tower. This process will provide you with an opportunity to engage in reasonable, relevant, and timely communication regarding this proposal. This notification will also be submitted to the Cariboo Regional District and ISED as part of our application for land use concurrence.

Additionally, the public will be invited to comment on the proposed site in response to a public notice that will be placed in the *100 Mile Free Press* publication. The public notice will run for two consecutive issues on October 20th and October 27th, 2022. The public will then have 30 days to submit comments and questions to myself on behalf of TELUS.

I will acknowledge receipt of comments and questions received within 14 days and address all relevant and reasonable concerns within 60 days. The commenting member of the public will then have 21 days to reply to the response. A summary of all comments received and our responses will then be submitted to ISED.

Site Details

1. *Purpose* - The purpose of the proposed tower is to expand TELUS' wireless coverage in the rural residential areas surrounding Watch Lake and Green Lake as well as along roadways in the area in support of public safety. Currently, there are no suitable existing antenna support structures or other feasible structures that can be utilized and, as a result, a new tower is required. The tower, if constructed, will provide improved wireless connectivity in terms of reliability and speed for those in the vicinity of the facility.

2. *Location and Land Use* - The tower is proposed to be located at 6303 Pioneer Road, Watch Lake, BC V0K 2K1. The subject property is home to the Watch Lake-North Green Lake Volunteer Fire Department and is located within the Cariboo Regional District. The geographical coordinates for the tower site are 51.454318, -121.132882. The tower is proposed to be located in the rear yard of the subject property in the northeastern corner of the lot. The subject property is an approximately 0.99 acre lot that is setback from adjacent residences. The fire hall property was selected as it is centrally located in the area requiring service improvements. Additionally, the tower is adjacent to an existing access road and power supply, minimizing the need for TELUS to develop additional supporting infrastructure.
3. *Safety Code 6* – ISED requires all wireless carriers to operate in accordance with Health Canada's safety standards. TELUS confirms that the tower described in this notification package will be installed and operated on an ongoing basis so as to comply with Health Canada's *Safety Code 6 including combined effects with the local radio environment*, as may be amended from time to time.
4. *Site Access* – TELUS is proposing to access the site via Pioneer Road and an existing access driveway that extends into the subject property. TELUS' compound will be contained within a chainlink fence to mitigate public access.
5. *Environment* - TELUS confirms that the installation is excluded from environmental assessment under the *Impact Assessment Act*.
6. *Design* - This proposal is for a 60.0 meter tall self-support tower as well as a 3.0-meter tall lightning rod (63.0 meters of total height including the lightning rod). The tower will house numerous panel antennas and multiple dishes in support of a variety of communication technologies. A preliminary design of the tower profile and compound plan is included in this notification for your reference.
7. *Transport Canada* - The tower will be marked in accordance with the Department of Transportation and NAV Canada requirements.
8. *Structural Considerations* - TELUS confirms that the antenna structure described in this notification package will apply good engineering practices including structural adequacy during construction.
9. *Land Use Authority* - The Cariboo Regional District does not have an Antenna Siting Protocol for towers proposed on privately-owned land and as such we are applying ISED's Default Public Consultation process in consultation with Cariboo Regional District staff.
10. *Co-Location* - TELUS will consider all applications for tower sharing and co-location in accordance with ISED protocols.

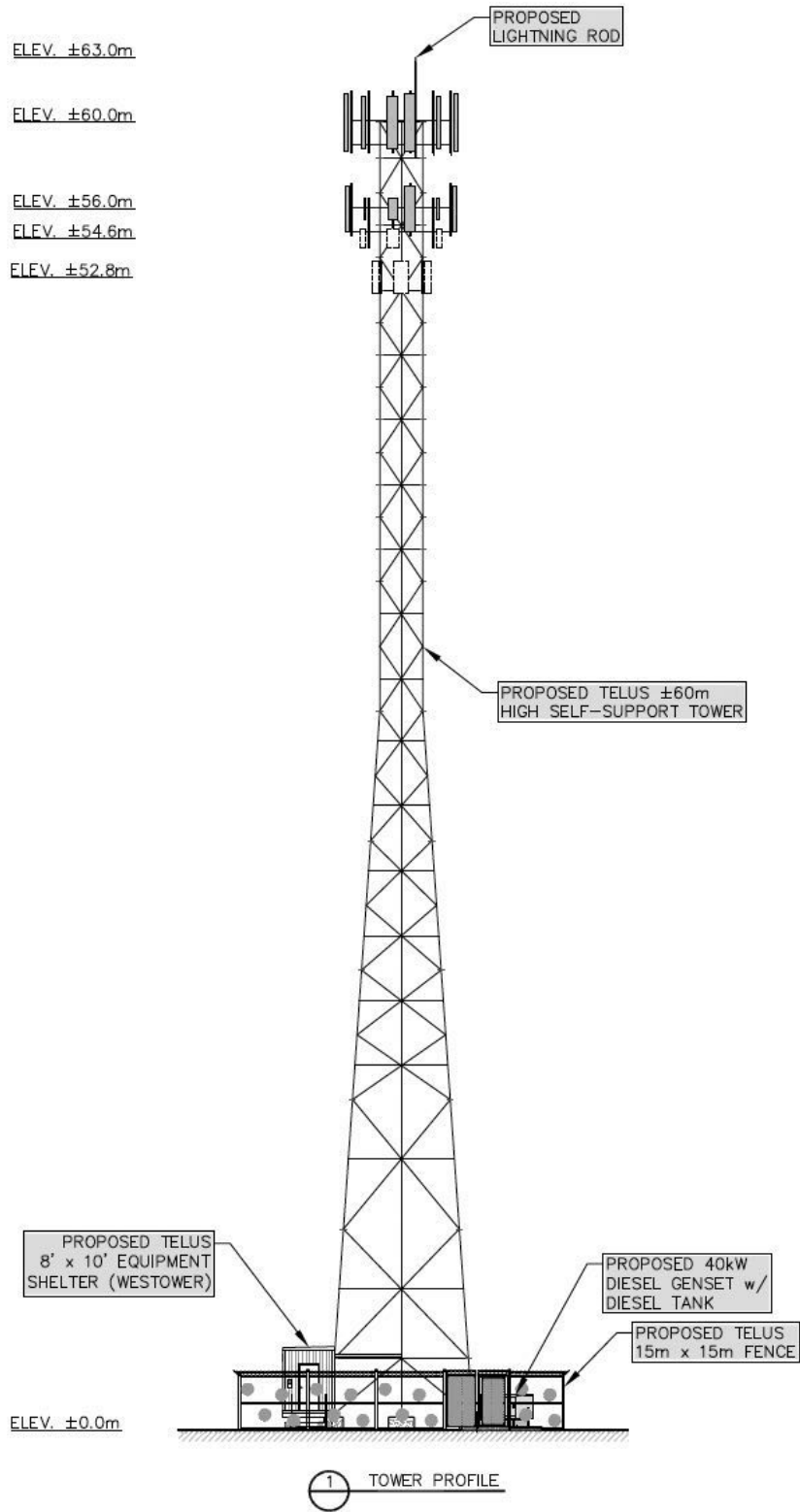

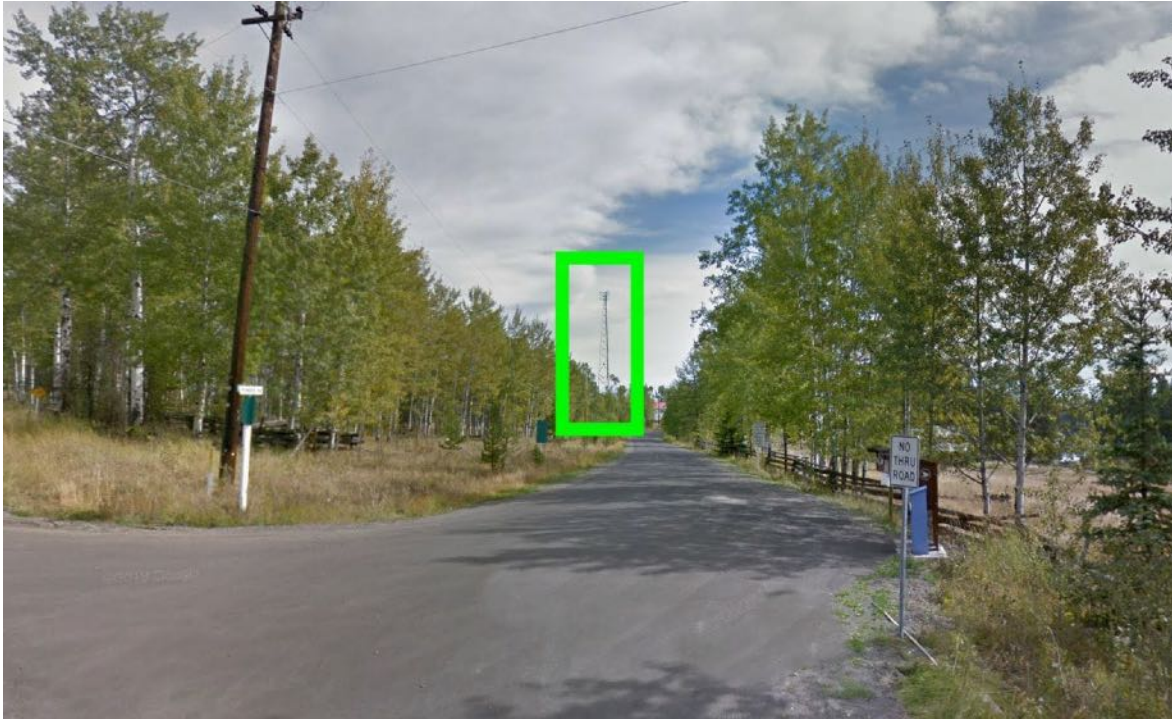


Site Plan (for discussion purposes only)

Youth soar high above the South Cariboo

“My house is so small!”
That was just one of Chloe Friesen and Jaidyn Lange’s observations as they flew above the South Cariboo last weekend during the 100 Mile Flying Club’s 10th Annual Junior Aviator Day. Both agreed that their first time in an airplane will not be one they soon forget.
“We just wanted to go and fly and see what it’s like,” Chloe said. “We saw a different point of view (up there.)”

Jaidyn, who lives in Lac La Hache, said the experience was awesome and her expectations were blown out of the water.
“I thought stuff was going to be a little bit bigger than it seemed. Everything looked like ants,” Jaidyn recalled. “It was incredible, an amazing feeling.”

That kind of reaction is exactly what Ursula Hart, president of the flying club, wants to foster in the community’s youth. This year, for the club’s 10th consecutive flying day she said they had six planes take 44 children up into the air.

“We’ve seldom had such a beautiful day and I think everyone really enjoyed getting involved and showing the kids their backyards,” Hart said. “It has been a really chill, lovely day to do this. It was like glass up there, no turbulence at all.”

Hart said thanks to the number of pilots those who attended didn’t have to wait long to get into a plane. After a 10-minute basic ground school, groups of three were taken up into the skies in a Cessna. One of the

pilots was Len Aune, who took Chloe and Jaidyn up for their first time.
“It’s been a great day. A real laid back beautiful day, might as well be in the middle of summer,” Aune said. “This kind of weather is perfect for

flying. The kids enjoyed it, I know.”
Right now Hart said there are a lot of career opportunities in the aviation industry for young people including ground crew, mechanics, cabin crew, air traffic control and pilots. Aune, who has been flying since 1982, said it makes him happy to

see young people take an interest in flying. Chloe and Jaidyn agreed that they’d love the chance to go on another flight someday. They both also said they’re open to the idea of pursuing a career of some kind in the aviation industry, Chloe adding she’d like to be a pilot.

“At a younger age I kind of wanted to be a mechanic but our pilot said pilots and engineers are needed so now I’m kind of considering engineering,” Jaidyn said.

South Cariboo represented at Dogs with Jobs

Dogs With Jobs was a mixed bag for local dog handlers but inspired them to renew their sport.

Last weekend, local stock dog handlers Peter Wells and Shelley Minato headed to Barriere to compete in one of the first cattle dog competitions in years. Both said the weekend was exciting and nostalgic.

“Many years ago, there were a lot more competitions and it all died out. It was very exciting to be back at it again,” Wells said.

When the competition began Wells, who has been training dogs for 30 years, was first up with his dog Cowdog Rowdy Yates. Before the event, he said the organizers had trouble finding cattle for the event. Rather than cows that are used to stock dogs, Wells said they were only able to find a herd of unruly animals that were “mean to everybody.”

Their temperament combined with

the poor design of the initial course meant Rowdy took a few battle wounds. Wells said the course was too narrow and forced his dog to get much closer to the cows than he usually would.

“They’re very brave dogs and get right in there heeling the cattle. He took a couple of kicks to the head, that was quite scary,” Wells said. “I didn’t have to take him out and he’s fine now but they stopped the event at that time and redesigned the course. It took everybody there to come together and agree to keep the show going, I was really pleased with that.”

After the redesign, Wells said the rest of the event went well, even though he came in fourth place in all the categories he competed in. He said even those who missed out on prize money went home with premium dog food thanks to a \$5,000 donation on behalf of 100 Mile Ranch and Feed Supply and Canadian Naturals.

“They had 80 to 90 bags of premium dog food that retailed for \$70 a bag. One of the wonderful things about this sponsorship is that even people who came dead last got to go home with \$200 worth of dog food.”

Minato said she gave four presentations during the weekend where she showed how she’d trained her border collies, Cinch and Tack, to pull a kicksled. She said border collies are

working dogs with excellent work ethics and high intelligence.

“To keep these dogs happy, they must be active, fit and intel-

lectually stimulated. Using my dogs year-round is great for them and me: the team has a purpose, and it is far better to work with them than to use my wheelbarrow or quad,” Minato said. “The audience interest was keen and the response was very positive.”

Wells said Minato’s demonstration was a “huge hit” and he was amazed at how well it went.

Now that he’s warmed up, Wells said he intends to host his own mountain cow dog competition in 2023. He plans to hold it on his property out in Buffalo Creek and said it will involve

handlers competing on horseback alongside their dogs.

“It will be a mountain trial right here in Buffalo Creek,” Wells said. “We sold my home of 62 years out in the mountains

so now we have a lot more time and wheelbarrow loads of money. I’m in a position now to indulge myself a little bit and put one of these events on. I’m really keen to do this.”

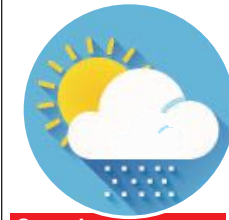

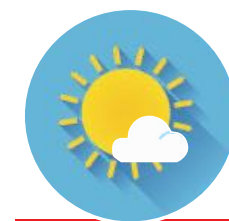

Re. Public Notice: Proposed Telus Communications Facility

To Brian;

Watch Lake North Green Lake is a vibrant rural community approximately 30 kilometres southeast from the town of 100 Mile House in the Cariboo Regional District. The members of our community are a blend of full-time residents and seasonal and part-time residents. There are also several resorts for vacationers, a Provincial Park with camping and day use, as well as many fishers and outdoor enthusiasts enjoying both lakes and the area that surrounds us.

The demography of the area is somewhat varied, with many full-time residents being older and retired. And there are more folks retiring to the community every year. There are also younger families here and more families have been settling in the area over the past few years. The community is growing with permanent residents. Those who live here all year, as well as those who have cabins and homes seasonally, also bring visitors and family to the community. The visitors inevitably rely on their cell phones.

Many full-time residents have landlines but not all, most part-time and seasonal residents do not. Visitors to the area have only cell phones. Those who rely on their cell phones must find a "sweet spot" to use the phone, the calls often drop, and generally there is only one bar. When travelling around our community, or to and from town, there is very little cellular service and one must rely on being in a "sweet spot". All visitors to the park and the resorts rely on their cell phones.

The lack of reliable cellular service is a major concern for a number of reasons. Our community often has power outages due to falling trees in seasonal storms, windstorms and other harsh weather conditions. While a few of us with landlines have access to older phones to plug-in, in case an emergency should arrive, most do not. For many seniors, and families with small children, this is a safety concern.


With rural distances, in the event of an accident or vehicle break down, especially in the winter months, having only sporadic service becomes a major concern, again especially for seniors and those with small children.

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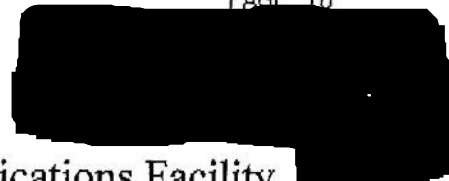
