1. What plans has your organization made to fund its activities over the next 3-5 years?

The 100 Mile Nordics activities are funded through ongoing membership and trail fees, facility rentals, donations, and grant funding. We continue our activities in these areas and explore new funding sources as they become available.

2. If your organization charges user fees/memberships/admission, attach your current fee structure.

3. What are your organization's specific goals and objectives for this year? How do they differ from previous years?

One of our most specific goals for this year is the integration of our new snow grooming machine (Pistenbully 100) into our operations. For the 2022/23 season we look forward to grooming more trails, more efficiently, more often. Another of our goals is to keep our prices for membership and passes the same as last year, to remain as affordable as possible for those on fixed incomes. Our longer-term objectives include increasing the number of visits we host from local and out-of-town Nordic skiers, growing our youth coaching and racing programs, and surveying our members — as part of a strategic planning process to identify appropriate goals and actions for the club's continued success.

4. Who does your organization serve?

Most of our clientele are community members of the South Cariboo {approximately 85%). We also host local skiers from neighbouring communities in the CRD, and out-of-town visitors. In the 2022/23 season we sold 296 memberships, including 88 family passes. We also hosted 632 day pass Nordic skiers and 114 day pass snowshoe visitors. This is a slight drop from our previous year's attendance totals, due in part to extreme cold weather reducing attendance in mid-winter. In addition, our club supports local youth with skills development, coaching, and racing programs.

PROJECT SUMMARY SHEET

1. Brief Description of Proposed Use of Grant Being Applied For:

We will use the grant monies to help with the increased costs for facility and equipment insurance we face

due to market conditions and the addition of a new piece of equipment valued at a quarter-million dollars to our snow grooming fleet. Along with increased capabilities and efficiencies, we knew increased insurance costs would accompany this new equipment. However, inflation and other factors have increased our expected insurance bill even higher, as the included price quote indicates. The grant monies will help us defray insurance costs for the 2022/23 season, maintain our current membership and pass rates in the face of inflation, and assist the Society as we continue to serve our community.

2. How do you know there is a need for this service/project in our community?

The new snow groomer replaces our previous machine, quickly adopted and put into service with the Williams Lake Nordic ski club. The new equipment expands our capabilities, helping us meet increasing demand for affordable winter recreation from the South Cariboo and beyond. We want to groom more trails more often; not only for locals but to deliver economic benefits to the community as a destination facility for visitors.

3. Is your agency applying for funds from other levels of government or other sources for this project?

5. Please describe the impact of this application being denied or approval of an amount less than requested.

We are applying to suitable funding programs for this project throughout the year -- as we identify potential sources. We have earmarked this grant for assistance application specifically to our insurance needs. We can fund 100% of our insurance bill without additional grant funding. The primary purpose of the application is to help us defray our increased insurance costs so we can maintain our current programs and price structure for our members and visitors, who are feeling the impact of price increases in their family budgets. If our application is denied, or we are awarded a smaller amount than requested, we will review our expenses across our programs. As adequate insurance is a 'must-have' for us, progress on new initiatives, such as our soon-to-be-announced pilot program to support Ukranian war refugees with memberships and rental equipment, may need to be reconsidered or resized to match our available budget.

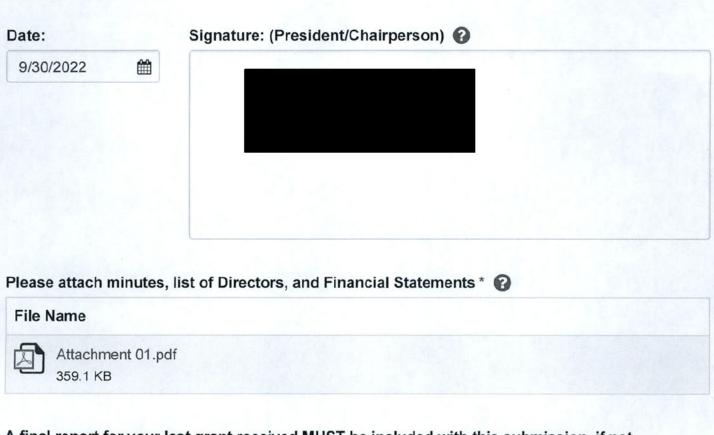

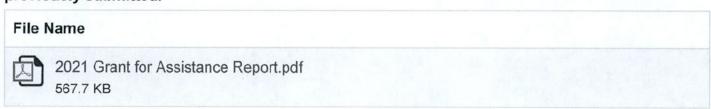

A key measure of success will be our attendance rates at the conclusion of the 2022/23 ski season.
