Please explain why your project is needed in your community.

This project is needed in Lone Butte to continue to build cultural tourism, provide a central outdoor gathering place for both locals and visitors, and provide a venue to expand community events. Currently, the centre of Lone Butte is the home of three historical sites, the water tower, the Alice Singleton house, and the Diefenbunker. Relocating the 1930s school house 6 km to create a historic hub, all within walking distance. Adding a landscaped lawn and tables draws in visitors and helps keep tourists in the area longer. Lone Butte becomes a day trip for tourists staying at one of the many waterfront resorts and ranches. The landscaping and tables create a welcoming space for families and friends and can act as an additional location for events such as Lone Butte Rocks Festival and the Annual Craft and Flea Market.

Lone Butte is a small community located at the intersection of the Gold Rush Trail and the Land of Hidden Waters. The local economy is driven by tourism. Developing a heritage gathering space provides event hosting space for the Lone Butte Historical Society to raise money and encourage donations. It will also encourage more people to stop and visit the community resulting in visits to restaurants and shops adding to the local economy.

This site will be open to everyone and will share history and culture through signage, displays and artifacts. The historic society is made up of old and new community members, some descending from settling families. Creating a place to share this community culture will help build the community of Lone Butte.

Located right on Hwy 24, the upgraded property will attract people to stop and explore. With two historic buildings, the bunker, landscaped lawns, and tables, this site will physically be greatly improved.

The society already maintains and holds insurance for the buildings and site. If anything it will reduce maintenance efforts by having everything located in close proximity.
