# **Short Summary:**

NCLGA Resolution on Support for Local Governments Implementing the Declaration Act

### **Voting:**

Corporate Vote - Unweighted

#### Memorandum:

At the February 3, 2023, Board of Directors meeting, the Board adopted resolution 2023-2-14, as follows:

That a resolution for the 2023 North Central Local Government Association's Annual General Meeting and Convention be drafted requesting that the Agricultural Land Commission revert to its previous system of receiving Agricultural Land Reserve applications directly rather than processing them through the CRD Board. The CRD should be a referral agency to provide input rather than having the final decision on whether an ALR application goes forward, given the limited information the Board receives in these circumstances.

Since the meeting, staff reviewed the background of the resolution, core concerns, and ultimate considerations with Director Massier. In review, it was identified that the core concern was navigating the impacts of indigenous rights and title while administering local government responsibilities under provincial statutes and regulations, including the *Agricultural Land Commission Act*.

The focus on research and development for this resolution as a result focused on the broader impacts of the *Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act [Declaration Act]* which was adopted into law in 2019. The Act calls for reforms to Provincial laws to implement the principles of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in order to reflect their rights and title.

Staff are now presenting the following resolution for the Board's consideration and referral to the North Central Local Government Association (NCLGA):

WHEREAS all levels of government in British Columbia have a role in advancing the principles of reconciliation as set out in the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act;

AND WHEREAS local governments have statutory obligations in relation to a number of Provincial Acts and regulations, which has resulted in expectations on local government to more broadly consider the principles of reconciliation when exercising those statutory obligations;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the North Central Local Government Association and Union of B.C. Municipalities lobby the Province of BC to provide timely clarification, support, and involvement for local governments regarding the expectations and requirements of local governments in advancing commitments to reconciliation and UNDRIP when fulfilling their statutory obligations under relevant provincial legislation.
