Maintenance:

Performed by Road Maintenance Contractors Current Maintenance Agreement 2019-2029

- Each contractor repairs and maintains the driving surface, completes all roadside upkeep and handles bridge and winter maintenance.
- Responsibilities within the Maintenance Agreement are broken down in to two main categories: Routine and Quantified
 - Routine:
 - Set items that are completed each year/season and rarely vary in scope
 - Quantified:
 - Activities that are planned based area needs, though some are cyclical. A portion of the overall yearly contract value is set aside for quantified activities and the Quantified Plan is approved by the local ministry staff.

Maintenance:

- Routine Activities:
 - Summer:
 - Temporary Patching, Sweeping, Debris Removal, Rest Areas, Safety Patrol, Emergency response
 - Winter:
 - Snow Removal, Traction Control, Anti-Icing, Avalanche Response
- Quantified Activities:
 - Summer:
 - Permanent pothole patching, Grading, Dust Control, Gravelling, Base Repairs, Ditching, Culvert Replacements
 - Winter
 - Majority of 'winter' specific activities are considered routine

Rehabilitation:

Ministry Driven Projects and Initiatives – Items beyond regular day to day maintenance

- District Projects managed by our local Ops Staff
 - Gravel resurfacing
 - Cattleguard Replacements
 - Smaller scale construction projects (pullouts, rest areas)
 - Small/medium scale safety improvements (signage, lighting)
- Provincial Projects typically managed by specialized teams
 - New road construction
 - Large scale resurfacing projects
 - Major bridge repair/replacement
 - Large culvert replacements

Regional District Involvement

There is certainly room for input or recommendations in both the Maintenance Contractors Quantified Plan as well as District Plan; however, planning typically happens well in advance of construction season (2-5years)

- Communicating wants/needs:
 - Preferably requests go through one point of contact. In the past that has been the CAO to the MoTI Operations Manager for the respective Service Area.
 - This allows information to flow through our internal process, allowing road area manager to focus on their daily responsibilities
 - Safety related items needing immediate attention should be directed to the Maintenance Contractor's 24/7 reporting lines
