Emergency Preparedness Committee Brief, October 12, 2023 BC Emergency and Disaster Management Act Modernization

Background

On October 3, 2023, the Province introduced Bill 31 the Emergency and Disaster Management Act, which will replace the Emergency Program Act.

Overview of major policy concepts

- Shift to four phases of emergency management
- Guiding principles and recognition of Indigenous rights
- Require consideration of climate change
- Broaden definitional framework for emergencies.
- New tools for response and recovery E.g.: ability to order assistance require a municipality to host evacuees from another municipality, power to order business closures, durations of states of emergency will be longer, Recovery periods.
- Recognizes plural and dynamic forms of Indigenous governance.
- Agreements for co-management and shared decision-making
- Requires coordination, collaboration, and provision of information between partners –
 New consultation guidelines.
- Includes and protects Indigenous knowledges.
- Addresses disproportionate impacts and promotes cultural safety.
- Accountability and transparency- full review of the legislation within five years of it receiving Royal Assent.
- Recognizes critical infrastructure owner roles in risk assessments and emergency
 management- The provincial government will be authorized to order critical
 infrastructure owners to take mitigation or preparation actions and will be able to take
 steps to ensure the coordination of critical infrastructure owners during the response
 and recovery phases.
- Recognizes the important role volunteers play Province to establish standards, protocols, and procedures for volunteers.
