The Arts Council accounts for its activities on a fund accounting basis appropriate for a society using the deferral method. No amortization is recorded on capital assets.

The Council is incorporated under the Societies Act of British Columbia. The Council is a volunteer-run, community-based organization dedicated to developing opportunities for area residents to experience and/or participate in creative and cultural endeavours.

#### 4. SPECIAL PROJECTS FUND

These are funds put aside for worthwhile events promoting the Arts hosted by the Arts Council or a Member Group, and include concerts, stage performances, artistic displays, and also include funding for Member Group Grants, which are awarded in May.

#### 5. SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

The Council is committed to providing annual scholarships to graduate students of Peter Skene Ogden Secondary School on the following amounts. The scharships are awarded in June. Only one scholarships were awared in the current year.
