- The Name of the Society is 100 Mile Festival of the Arts.
- 2. The purposes of the Society are:
 - to promote artistic endeavours in the performing arts
 - b. to encourage education in the performing arts
 - c. to organize and operate an annual Festival of the Arts in conjunction with the B. C. Festival of the Arts
 - d. to raise funds and accept donations to further the above objects.

AGM 100 MILE FESTIVAL OF THE ARTS PARKSIDE ART GALLERY - basement Monday, June 19, 2023 at 7:00 p.m.

Welcome:

The meeting was chaired by Ginny-Lou Alexander, President We welcomed Chris Saban to the committee.

Adopt Agenda: Bruce moved; Don Jones 2nd. Carried.

Minutes:

The minutes of the 2022 AGM had been reviewed ahead of time. Kathy moved that they be adopted as circulated; Kelsey 2nd. Carried.

Treasurer's Report:

4. Don J. presented the <u>Proposed Financial Budget for 2023-2024.</u> He moved that the budget be approved as presented; Elaine 2nd. Carried.

Membership Fees: Kelsey moved that annual membership fee remain at \$10.00. Lynda 2nd. Carried. Don collected the annual \$10 membership fee from members present, along with an updated Membership form.

Ginny-Lou presented her report. Bruce moved that the report be accepted as presented; Don J. 2nd.Carried.

Kathy Wolczuk nominated Ginny-Lou Alexander, Bruce 2nd. Ginny-Lou accepted a 2-year term. Bruce Madu nominated Brian Porritt, Don Jones 2nd. Brian had previously agreed to let his name stand if nominated, thereby accepting a 2-year term.

Kathy Wolczuk nominated Lynda Lipsett, Bruce 2nd. Lynda accepted a 2-year term.

Bruce Madu nominated Don Jones, Kathy 2nd. Don accepted a 2-year term.

Bruce Madu nominated Kelsey Fast, Lynda 2nd. Kelsey accepted a 2-year term.

For the 2023-2024 year, the nine Festival Directors are:

Ginny-Lou Alexander, Kathy Wolczuk, Bruce Madu, Brian Porritt, Sarah Thirsk, Lynda Lipsett, Don Jones, Don Kinasewich and Trudy Endacott. (Note: Sarah Thirsk and Don Kinasewich have moved out of the community)

New Business:

1. Scholarship Selection Criteria - Discussion -Ginny-Lou summarized what Don Kinasewich had previously proposed at an earlier meeting: that if a private donor would like to sponsor a bursary, that that would be appropriate, as the Festival committee does not want to be involved with determining the financial need of students for an FOA sponsored bursary. It was generally agreed that we not change our Scholarship Selection criteria.

Discipline Heads:

It was agreed that Ginny-Lou will continue as discipline head for SA and Piano; Lynda will continue as discipline head of Vocal and Instrumental; Judi and Kim will share discipline head

**Incidentally, it was agreed that dance performers will be allowed to assemble either backstage or in the basement, before their performance on stage, rather than be seated in the auditorium prior to performing.
