ADAC HISTORY



The Cariboo Regional District approved the establishment of the North Cariboo Agricultural Development Advisory Committee (ADAC) through the North Cariboo Economic Development Function and its adoption in 2018.

The committee's purpose is to advise the Board on matters referred to ADAC respecting agricultural development in the region.

Additional matters may also be referred to ADAC by the Board of Directors, for its consideration and advice.



THE COMMITTEE'S MISSION IS TO WORK WITH AGRICULTURE STAKEHOLDERS
WITHIN THE CARIBOO REGION TO SUSTAINABLY EXPAND AGRICULTURAL
PRODUCTION, CAPACITY, AND DIVERSITY.

THE WORK OF ADAC

The top 3 strategic plan recommendations in 2018, when the NC ADAC was established, were:

- Regional Agri-food Center
- Agriculture Education Program
- Agriculture Area Plan

In addition to these significant projects, ADAC has offered consultation to the CRD on matters such as:

- Provincial Meat Processing Regulation
- ALR/ALC Residential Flexibility
- Request for support from KPU Institute for Sustainable Food Systems Extension Services

The CRD approached the North Cariboo ADAC with the opportunity to evolve & become a committee of the whole region.

The CRD requested that Cariboo ADAC act as a steering committee to develop the AAP for the region.

November 2021 saw the CRD board approve a new bylaw, thus the creation of the region-wide Cariboo Agriculture Development Advisory Committee.
