## **Short Summary:**

Consideration of requests from the CRD Agricultural Development Advisory Committee (ADAC)

## **Voting:**

#### Memorandum:

CRD Staff have received a number of requests from the Agricultural Development Advisory Committee (ADAC).

- 1. ADAC has requested CRD to initiate developing a Drought Preparedness Plan and a Drought Emergency Response protocol. Currently, the CRD does not have an active response to drought in our region, and it is dealt with at the Provincial level. Staff recognize that prolonged periods of dry weather can result in crop damage and shortages in water supply for livestock. There is online information and provincial guidance available to help producers prepare and manage drought. The CRD Emergency Programs Department will consider attendance at workshops and events regarding agricultural resiliency to help educate producers about existing resources available.
- 2. ADAC has proposed an allocation of staff time to investigate the development of Livestock Exclusion Fencing as a Local Service Area Function. For background, the CRD Board endorsed the Agricultural Policy in 2016 which requires a fencing and buffering covenant on title for all new subdivision and rezoning proposals that are adjoining lands located in the Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR) or properties with active agricultural operations including Crown range, Crown land leased or tenured for agricultural purposes. As per our policy, it is the responsibility of the landowners to install and maintain fencing along the non-agricultural side of the edge. Investigation of a Livestock Exclusion Fencing Service is not considered in the 2024 Business Plans.

3. Staff support the ADAC suggestion to publish information regarding fencing responsibilities within a Livestock District in the Spring 2024 edition of the CRD UpFront newsletter. The information may include related resources such as the Livestock Act, the Trespass Act, the Forestry and Range Practice Act, the BC Ministry of Agriculture and Food Right to Farm legislation, and the CRD Agricultural Policy. Planning staff will work with Communications department to provide information in Spring 2024 UpFront. This action does not require Board Direction.
