NCLGA Resolution on Emergency and Disaster Management Act

#### Memorandum:

At the January 12, 2024 Board Meeting, the Board directed staff to prepare a resolution for consideration at the upcoming North Central Local Government Association's Annual General Meeting calling for specific regulations for regional districts under the new *Emergency and Disaster Management Act*. This supplements previous feedback submitted by the Cariboo Regional District to the Province at both the elected and staff level. For background, please refer to the attached letter from Chair Wagner addressed to the Honourable George Heyman, Acting Minister of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness. The letter summarizes many of the issues for rural and remote regional districts like the CRD which are created by the new Act.

Considering this, the following resolution is recommended:

WHEREAS the Emergency and Disaster Management Act seeks to set out a comprehensive framework for the management of wildfires, floods, and other disasters in a manner consistent with the SENDAI Framework;

AND WHEREAS the statutory responsibilities, geographic disparity, and legal powers of regional districts are not recognized by the Emergencies and Disaster Management Act;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the North Central Local Government Association and Union of BC Municipalities call on the Province of BC to develop regulations under the Emergencies and Disaster Management Act in collaboration with representatives of rural and remote regional districts, to ensure that emergency powers and responsibilities impacting regional districts are designed in consideration of the unique challenges faced by rural and remote communities during all phases of emergency management.
