

The overarching purpose of this project is to install a tournament grade disc golf course at the Esler Sports Complex in Williams Lake BC. This application is for signage and tee box installation only. The course installation project at the Esler Sport Complex is intended to advance and promote the sport of disc golf in the community of Williams Lake and the surrounding areas. This is consistent with the Cariboo Disc Golf Club (the Club) values, as follows:

The course is currently being developed on Cariboo Regional District (CRD) private land for which the club is a registered user with an occupancy agreement and has liaised with CRD representatives, Esler Sports Complex user groups and Esler Subdivision residents to install. The installation of the course in this location is consistent with the sports complex's current function of providing exceptional recreation opportunity within the Cariboo Region. Course development is already underway at the Esler Sports Complex with the fairways being roughed in and the targets installed. This grant is intended to fund signage purchase and installation and to complete all the planned tee pads.

Please explain why your project is needed in your community.

The anticipated community benefits from this project will be far reaching. Given the proximity of the course to the existing recreational opportunities at the Esler Sports Complex it is anticipated that the course will receive widespread usage by the other user groups in addition to club members and visitors to the region. It will create new opportunities for the neighboring subdivision residents to play a competition ready course within walking distance. The low overhead cost of future course maintenance should keep the course playable for decades with low effort.

Disc golf is an emerging sport in the Cariboo but there are over 6700 courses in Canada and the United States. There are several provincial tournaments in BC and Williams Lake will be playable in these events once developed. Most courses are free to play, and discs are inexpensive creating a low-cost sport that virtually anyone can play. Disc golf can be an environmentally friendly sport that does not require tree removal or grass mowing to be playable. This is one of the appeals of the Esler Disc Golf Course, it is situated within a Douglas Fir forest that can be developed while maintaining wildlife and forestry values. Once completed, course maps and information can be uploaded to the UDisc App and be available to the global disc golf community potentially drawing players from everywhere.

Will the project foster cultural awareness and contributes to inclusivity? if so, please explain

Yes. Due to the inexpensive nature of disc golf, few financial barriers exist when being introduced to the sport. Because of this, players from all socio-economic backgrounds can and do enjoy the sport. Most courses are free to play, with no memberships required. This framework encourages people of all backgrounds to get together and enjoy the sport. It is in this way that disc golf contributes to inclusivity and cultural awareness.

Will this project enhance the physical appearance, character, or natural environment in the community? If so, please explain

Yes, the Esler Disc Golf Course is already partially developed by way of harvested fairways and installed targets. This creates appealing visual aesthetics within the Interior Douglas Fir forested setting when viewed from the adjacent subdivision and access road to the sports complex. Some of the harvested fairways border a low mobility trail and the site is beginning to look and feel like parkland.

Will the completion of the project will result in reduced operation, maintenance and related costs over the life-cycle of the asset? If so, please explain

Yes, once completed the course is expected to require low effort annual maintenance. This is due in part to the local ecology but also the flexibility that disc golf offers with regards to playable terrain. Disc golf can be played in a forest setting requiring no grass mowing and featuring abundant obstacles. Future maintenance is anticipated to involve debris removal and perhaps some minor brush removal at times. Disc golf courses are very resilient and can be playable for decades with minimal maintenance.

The installation of the course at the Esler Sports Complex creates a free of charge outdoor recreation facility that is consistent with the sports complex's current function of providing exceptional recreational opportunity within the Cariboo Region. The complex now hosts soccer, slow pitch, minor fastball and disc golf facilities.

Describe any accessibility concerns the completion of this project will alleviate:

This project is not expected to alleviate any accessibility concerns outside of the aforementioned low cost of play. In terms of physical mobility, the Esler Disc Golf Course does not support low mobility options. There is, however, a low mobility trail that borders portions of the course.

Describe any health and safety concerns the completion of this project will alleviate:

This project will encourage low cost physical activity, will be free to use and easily accessible. Sedentary lifestyles continue to create heath and wellness risks in today's society and the more a community can do to encourage regular exercise, the lower the long term risk to the health and wellness of its populace. Disc golf is a low impact sport that can be enjoyed by individuals of all fitness levels.

If the project will support resident/workforce attraction and retention, please explain how.

There are currently 3 playable disc golf courses in the region have already attracted many people to come and play. For disc golf players, having several local courses in the region is very appealing. There are few communities in BC that have several disc golf courses available for play on any given day and the Williams Lake area is fast becoming a disc golf hub. Players will find this attractive when considering relocating to the region.

How does the project result in the preservation/creation of an amenity that serves multiple uses?

The Esler Disc Golf Course creates an amenity that serves multiple purposes by developing the underutilized areas of the Cariboo Regional District private land for disc golf while also supporting wildlife, recreational trails and maintaining forestry values. In addition, the fairways create fireguards that may stop or slow the spread of a wildfire from advancing towards to adjacent subdivision and other sports complex infrastructure.


