Our shoots are popular among other archers in B.C. but most of our targets are worn and some have reached the end of their life and need to be replaced after multiple repairs.

After a decline in membership, our club is starting to see more interest among both individuals and families in the South Cariboo, even drawing a couple of members as far away as Clinton. Peter Skene Ogden Secondary reached out this year about holding some archery classes and we recently promoted the club at the Garlic Festival and got a lot of interest, which we hope translates into new members this winter. Our indoor and outdoor shoots also draw 70-plus people every year and are considered one of the favourites on the archery circuit. In order to continue to provide quality shoots, as well as practice for our members, we need to have targets that will hold up.


