In addition to providing comfort quilts and other sewn items to various groups, our goal is create a class/workshop, that offer beginner quilting sessions to involve more community members and increase membership. Please also note that we are sourcing materials from local businesses.

How does this projects, activity or event strengthen and enhance the well-being of the community, promote volunteerism and support the goals and strategic priorities of the City of Williams Lake?

We are requesting funds to support our ongoing projects. Our eventual goal is to have 6 machines and accompanying supplies which support and enhance our ongoing projects in the community. A quilt offers warmth, care, and compassion.

Describe the key activities and timelines to complete the project/event.

We have many members working on different projects at any given time. Ongoing projects include quilts for ESS, quilts for Residential School Survivors, placemats and seasonal tray favours for Meals on Wheels, Christmas stockings for the CDC Yuletide dinner, a quilt for Hospice, sewing reconciliation quilts with Cataline Elementary students, and quilts to seniors in care. We are also giving 3 Quilts of Valour to veterans on November 11th. New to us this year is supporting the Friends of the Library fundraising project. We are making book bags, reading pillows, and quilts designed around the theme of a children's book

How will you determine if the project/event was successful?

The ability to show our support in the number of projects completed, growth in membership and enhanced awareness of our community involvement.

At this time, we are only applying for the grant from the City of Williams Lake.
