



**CARIBOO REGIONAL DISTRICT**

**BYLAW NO. 5560**

A bylaw of the Cariboo Regional District, in the Province of British Columbia, to establish fees and charges for curbside collection of solid waste.

**WHEREAS**, the *Environmental Management Act* and *Local Government Act* enable the Cariboo Regional District to make bylaws to regulate management of municipal solid waste;

**AND WHEREAS**, pursuant to the provisions of the *Local Government Act*, being Chapter 1 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 2015, and amendments thereto, a Board may, by bylaw, impose fees or charges in respect of all or part of a service;

**AND WHEREAS**, the Cariboo Regional District has an approved Solid Waste Management Plan which authorizes the establishment of curbside collection of solid waste;

**NOW THEREFORE**, The Board of Directors of the Cariboo Regional District, duly assembled in an open meeting, hereby enacts as follows:

1. CITATION:

This bylaw may be cited for all purposes as “Curbside Collection of Solid Waste Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 5560, 2026”.

2. DEFINITIONS:

**Carriage House** means an additional Dwelling Unit within a detached or semi-detached ancillary building.

**CRD** means the Cariboo Regional District.

**Curbside Collection Service** means collection of Residential Household Waste and/or Packaging and Printed Paper using a specialized vehicle with mechanical

apparatus for collection. Residential Household Waste will be collected by a third-party contractor in contract with the CRD. Packaging and Printed Paper collection will either be carried out by a third-party contractor in contract with the CRD or Recycle BC.

**Duplex** means one building containing two Dwelling Units located on a property which is used or intended to be used as a residence for two households, and which may or may not be strata titled.

**Dwelling, Multi Family** means a detached building, used exclusively for residential purposes, consisting of four or more Dwelling Units, either with private individual access or common access, such as apartments, condominiums, rowhouses and townhouses.

**Dwelling, Single Family** means a building consisting of not more than one Dwelling Unit used as a residence for no more than one household.

**Dwelling Unit** means a building or portion of a building used for residential occupancy, used or intended to be used primarily by one household, and usually containing cooking, eating, living, sleeping and sanitary facilities for domestic purposes.

**Fourplex** means one building containing four Dwelling Units located on a property which is used or intended to be used as a residence for four households, and which may or may not be strata titled.

**Hazardous Waste** means any material defined as such in the Hazardous Waste Regulation (BC Reg. 63/1988) as amended or replaced, which includes, but is not limited to: toxins, poisons, corrosives, irritants, flammables, ignitable materials and asbestos.

**Manufactured Home** means a Dwelling Unit that is:

- a) manufactured to and compliant with the Canadian Standards Association (CSA) Z-240 MH or CSA A277 MH series of standards;
- b) transportable;
- c) located in a place other than its place of manufacture; and
- d) excludes any Recreational Vehicle.

**Manufactured Home Park** means a parcel of land used or occupied for the purpose of providing spaces for the accommodation of three or more manufactured homes, including improvements, utilities and services and facilities for the residents, and may include lands under single ownership for limited term land-lease developments, or lands under common ownership for

developments approved under the Strata Property Act.

**Occupier** means a person who occupies or uses any land or building situated within the CRD boundaries, and includes without limitation, all tenants and lessees of the said lands or buildings.

**Packaging and Printed Paper** means recyclables managed by Recycle BC that are eligible to be collected in single stream curbside recycling, such as fibers (box board, cardboard, paper, etc.) and containers (plastic, metal and paper containing liquid when sold).

**Prohibited Waste** means PCB's, reactive waste, biomedical waste, Hazardous Waste, radioactive waste, waste that is on fire or smoldering, any material prohibited for landfilling, and liquid waste including: solvents, lubricating oil, flammable liquids and fuels, and pesticides.

**Property Owner** means registered owner of any lands or buildings situated within CRD boundaries.

**Recreational Vehicle** means a vehicle, either designed to be towed behind a motor vehicle or self-propelled, and includes such vehicles commonly known as travel trailers, fifth wheels, campers, park model recreational units, motor homes, or other similar vehicles designed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use.

**Recyclable Waste, Not Accepted Curbside** means ferrous and non-ferrous metals and products included in extended producer responsibility programs, including but not limited to: solvent and flammable liquids, pesticides, gasoline, pharmaceuticals, lubricating oils, empty oil containers, oil filters, paints, antifreeze, all batteries (lead-acid, alkaline, zinc-carbon, lithium, lithium-ion, nickel-metal hydride), polystyrene foam (Styrofoam), plastic bags, nylon bags, flexible plastics, electronic and electrical products and accessories, tires, and small appliances.

**Residential Household Waste** means residential generated domestic rubbish, waste and discarded materials including but not limited to food waste, household pet waste, plastic products, infant and adult diapers, non-recyclable packaging, crockery and glass, floor sweepings, soiled tissues and paper towels, and fabrics.

**Secondary Suite** means an additional Dwelling Unit located within a building of residential occupancy containing only one other Dwelling Unit and a part of a single real estate entity.

**Tote** means the curbside container with wheels provided for the collection of Residential Household Waste or Packaging and Printed Paper.

**Triplex** means one building containing three Dwelling Units located on a property which is used or intended to be used as a residence for three households, and which may or may not be strata titled.

**Vacant Property** means a taxable piece of property that has no active, permanent residential or commercial structures on it, including property that is not occupied by a legal owner or tenant for 6 months or more, or a property with a derelict, boarded-up, or razed structure.

3. PARTICIPATION:

- 3.1 Curbside Collection Service is mandatory in the service areas illustrated in Schedule A for properties with Single Family, Duplex, Triplex, or Fourplex Dwellings, unless an exemption is granted in accordance with this section.
  - a) Exemptions may be granted if use of curbside collection service would create a safety concern for the occupier.
- 3.2 Curbside Collection Service is not mandatory for Dwelling Units in Manufactured Home Parks. Property Owners of Manufactured Home Parks may contact the CRD to opt in.
- 3.3 Property Owners of new Dwelling Units shall contact the CRD to subscribe to the Curbside Collection Service.
- 3.4 Property Owners of additional Dwelling Units such as Carriage Houses or Secondary Suites may contact the CRD to register for additional Curbside Collection Services.
- 3.5 Vacant Properties, Multi Family Dwellings, and commercial operations will not receive or be billed for Curbside Collection Service.
- 3.6 Property Owners will be charged the annual service fee established in Schedule A based on the number of Residential Household Waste Totes delivered to a property. For example, the owner of a Duplex which has received two Residential Household Waste Totes will be billed twice the annual service fee.

4. COLLECTION:

- 4.1 Any Property Owner or Occupier of a Single Family, Duplex, Triplex, Fourplex or Manufactured Home dwelling who wishes to receive Curbside Collection Service must:
- a) deposit their Residential Household Waste and/or Packaging and Printed Paper into the corresponding supplied Tote(s); and
  - b) place the Tote(s) at the curb by the time specified by the CRD, on the scheduled collection day.
- 4.2 Totes set out for collection must:
- a) be situated with the opening side facing the roadway;
  - b) be on the edge of the roadway, unless directed otherwise by the CRD;
  - c) have lids closed;
  - d) be at least one meter away from other objects to the side of the Tote including, but not limited to, other Totes or collection containers, parked cars and vegetation; and
  - e) not contain Prohibited Waste.
- 4.3 The contents of any Tote placed out for Curbside Collection Service become the property of the CRD, provided the contents comply with the requirements of this bylaw. Only the CRD's agents and the Property Owner or Occupier of the premise from which the contents originate are permitted to remove any material from a Tote.
- 4.4 The CRD or its agents may inspect any Tote and its contents to determine compliance with this bylaw. Totes shall be available for inspection during collection days, at all reasonable hours, or on request.
- 4.5 Totes for collection of Packaging and Printed Paper found to contain Prohibited Waste and/or Recyclable Waste – Not Accepted Curbside will be tagged, and information will be left for the Occupier. If the unaccepted waste is of a significant amount (over  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the contents) the Tote will be returned to the property with an explanation to the Occupier. If there are repeat occurrences of significant amounts of unaccepted waste found in the recycling Tote, the Tote may be removed from the property.
- 4.6 Totes and their contents must not attract dangerous wildlife, as required by the *Wildlife Act*, RSBC 1996, c 488 as amended or replaced.

5. EFFECTIVE DATE:

This bylaw and its schedules take effect on March 1, 2026.

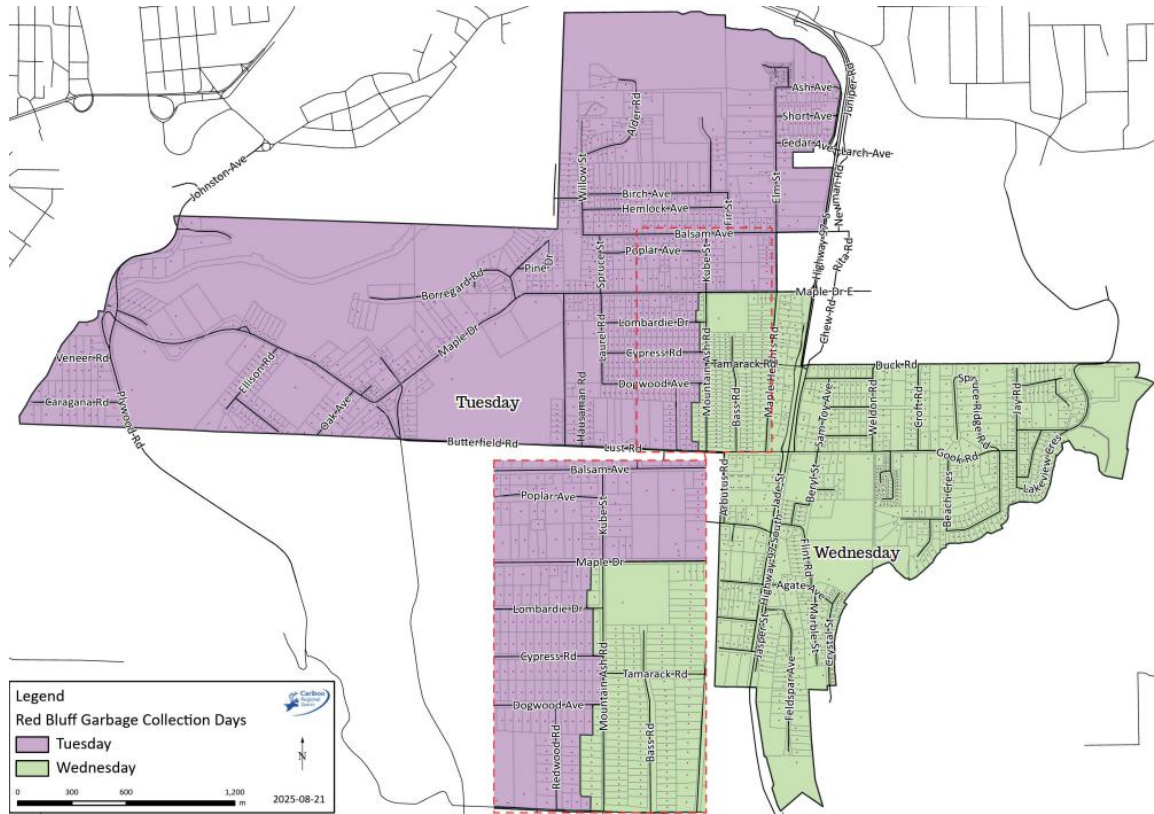
## SCHEDULE A CURBSIDE COLLECTION FEES AND SERVICE AREA MAPS

The CRD hereby establishes the following fees for curbside collection service:

- a) \$99.96 annually for each Residential Household Waste Tote.
- b) A 10% discount will be applied for complete payments made by May 31<sup>st</sup> annually.
